Present at 7:00 p.m. were Mayor Gray, Chair; Debra LaValley, Bonnie Schultz, Tom McGee, Peter Hoyt, Christian Scorzoni, and Michele S. Robinson, Superintendent of Schools.

Absent were: Jill Hadwen, SAC Representative – Sitting in for Jill Hadwen was Charlotte Hyde.

Mayor Gray, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:03 and Deb LaValley led the Committee in the Pledge of Allegiance and read the Mission Statement aloud.

Amesbury Public Schools Mission Statement

II. COMMENTS BY VISITORS AND DELEGATIONS

 A parent addressed the committee and thanked them for the development of the budget – good data and headed in the right direction – The parents are supporting the School Committee Budget..

II. PRESENTATIONS: Student Showcase

Nick Heitmann – Violinist; AHS Student

Eli Ratner - Tenor; AHS Student

Ms. Susanne Meyer - AHS Music and Performing Arts Teacher

Ms. Meyer began the presentation with recognizing 2 students Nick Heitmann and Eli Ratner accompanied by AHS Rhythmic participation in the 2015 All-State Orchestra and Chorus. The group spent 3 days in Boston and performed at Symphony hall. Nick played a selection for the audience with his violin. The rhythmic team joined Eli with their selection for the audience. Ms. Meyer was thanked by one of the parents in the audience for her countless hours of volunteering.

Mr. Hoyt thanked the students that had just performed and stated that it was breath-taking – stunned with the quality of music at AHS.

One of the parent's stated her disappointment of not having a full time band instructor at the middle school and high school.

Innovation School Conversion Plan

Eryn Maguire - Academy Principal

Lyn Griffin - Director of Teaching and Learning

Ms. Griffin started off the presentation with a hand out for the committee. This packet included the overview of the Innovation School and the proposal plan.

- An Innovation School is as in-district public school that can operate with increased autonomy and flexibly in many areas (curriculum; budget; schedule; polices; and professional development).
- Converting from Horace Mann Charter to Innovation
- Partnership with Pettingill House customized assessment system

- Can retain any unused funds which is different than the public school
- Plan to accept out of district students which may have a tuition working with DESE
- Will be at same location opening doors for the fall of 2015
- Next step the school committee will vote to authorize the Innovation School, for 5 years, on June 1, 2015.

Mrs. Schultz asked what the roles for School Committee were from Charter vs. Innovation. There will be a 5 year review and the Superintendent will evaluate the school each year. Mr. Scorzoni asked about the legal aspect of transferring, closing accounts, obligation, transitions, contracts, and shutting down? Ms. Griffin explained that in the packet, there is a DESE checklist, the stack-holders have been notified, Ms. McGuire is the Board of Contact and Ms. Griffin is a trustee. Dr. Robinson concluded by saying the teachers are part of the APS contract and will still have their jobs.

The discussion was then given to Eryn McGuire, Principal of the Academy – Ms. McGuire began by stating that Amesbury is one of three grants awarded in the state. She presented a power point outlining the goals (1. Curriculum and assessment; 2. Vocation and internship; 3. Therapeutic services); partnership with Pettingill House and the district role in guiding the process.

Mr. Hoyt questioned the new admission policy – Ms. McGuire stated that they will fill out an application, will have an interview (no longer a lottery) and will look at social and emotional assessment.

Ms. McGuire introduced her staff that were in attendance. She stated that this school was founded 15 years ago and to date there has been 100 graduates.

Ms. LaValley, as a board member, thanked them for the presentation and stated that this has been a lot of work and effort - Great placement. She asked how this information was communicated to the public – Ms. McGuire stated that in April there was a public forum which was well received. Dr. Robinson stated that this was remarkable work by all and spoke about how humble Eryn is directing this alternative education and partnerships.

Ms. LaValley concluded by asking if this information could be put on the website – Yes.

III. ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

A. Director of Teaching and Learning

Lyn Griffin spoke about the following:

- Curriculum Development = Phase 1 review on Go Math whether to continue with Go Math – scope and sequencing of this current program – is there enough time and amount of time of instructional times.
- Next area to look at ELA/Reading WAT have been meeting regularly to discuss needs
- Looking into revamping report cards getting a report card committee this summer work to be done in this area
- Title 1 Literacy Camp is tentatively scheduled for July 27-30 and August 3-6
- Assessments
 - May is MCAS Math will be done this week
 - MAP testing have until June 15th to complete spring testing
 - MKEA kindergarten teachers with their observation due to the state by June 1st.
- Report on expired licensure on teachers for this coming fall. Aspen will be updated as information comes in. Started tracking those teachers who are getting certified in Sheltered English Immersion Endorsement.

• Educator Evaluation – DESE has proposed 3 Alternative Pathways for districts: (1. More time; 2. Student goals & professional practice goals; 3. 5-step evaluation cycle) DESE needs information by June 30, 2015.

Mr. Hoyt asked for more information on the Summer Title 1 classes. Ms. Griffin stated classes will be offered to grade 1, 2 and 3 – ratio of 10 to 1 teacher – class size based on responses. Ms. LaValley asked if there will be parent and principal input on the report card committee - Yes

Motion by Mr. Scorzoni to take line item (IV. Communications – A. Student Advisory Council – Charlotte Hyde) out of order, second by Ms. LaValley. Vote: Yes – unanimous.

 Charlotte stated that they will be visiting the middle school this Tuesday to recruit incoming freshman to sign up for activities and clubs.

- Last Wednesday, May 13th budget was presented to the City Council. They were given a packet with each school's achievement plan; celebrations and concerns; action steps; identification measures and bench marks; lists of requests and then top 2 requests.

Mr. Hoyt stated that he and Mr. Scorzoni attended the City Council meeting and stated that he felt comfortable having Mr. Scorzoni represent the school committee. Mr. Hoyt had no time to offer his services for another meeting.
