

SYCAMORE MUSIC DEPARTMENT WINS STATE

April 26, 2023

The Sycamore High School (SHS) Music Department has won the IHSA Class A state music competition for the first time in school history. SHS placed first in the 2023 Illinois High School Association Music Sweepstakes competition for Class A schools. Statewide results were finalized April 26.

Results were calculated from the results of the IHSA Solo/Ensemble festival on March 4, and the IHSA Organizational Festival on April 14-15 (for bands, choirs,

and orchestras). A large number of highly rated student solos and ensembles, coupled with four "superior" scores (two vocal and two instrumental large ensemble scores) at the Organizational festival, led to Sycamore's first-place finish.

"We are extremely proud of our students and staff for finishing in first place in the state of Illinois in this very competitive competition," said Mr. Tim Carlson, Sycamore High School Principal. "This is a testament to their talents and hard work. We are also very fortunate to have such a supportive music community in Sycamore that assists our students and empowers them to compete at such a high level."

The Spartan: it's the iconic mascot displayed proudly by Sycamore students, staff, and community members. It's the name our sports teams play under. It's the mascot that represents the graduates that leave the halls of Sycamore and enter the next chapter of their lives.

The Spartan is currently the mascot of Southeast Elementary School, Sycamore Middle School, and Sycamore High School. Other mascots within the district are the North Stars, North Grove Hawks, South Prairie Eagles, and West Wildcats.

As the district conducted its elementary boundary study this past year, a theme of unity was something that was continually discussed. It became clear to district administrators and elementary principals that there was an opportunity to bring all of our schools together. Starting next year for the 2023-2024 school year, all seven schools in our district will finally share the same mascot—the Spartan.

"In a school environment, one important centerpiece is the mascot," said Sycamore Schools Superintendent Steve Wilder. "Changing all of our elementary schools to the Spartan mascot is something that has been discussed over the last few years, and we felt that it was the right time to bring our entire district together under one name."

Over the summer, the district will be implementing new signage and building updates to reflect this exciting announcement. When elementary students return to school in the fall—no matter if they attend North, North Grove, South Prairie, West, or Southeast—they will enter the halls as Spartans.

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
