


Special Education Monthly Board Report Emmett School District February, 2025

Special Education Demographics:

 As of February 6, 2025, the home page of our IEP platform (Edplan) shows 367 (up from 361 in December) students receiving Special Education with an additional 6 Referrals, and 15 Consents for Evaluation.

Department Projects:

• The State Department of Education, Special Education is conducting an abbreviated General Supervision File Review this year. One file has been selected for review, this is a secondary transition file. The EHS SpEd team is currently reviewing the file and preparing to upload it to the state platform for final review. All other Special Education Teachers are conducting an internal review of their caseloads using the state-developed GSFR Checklists.
