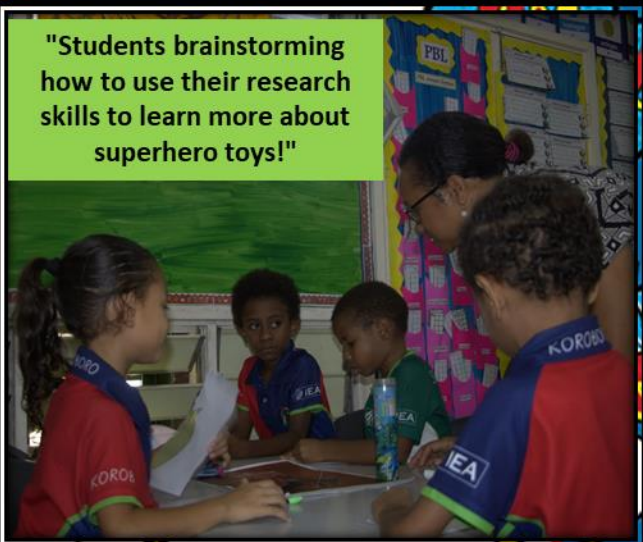

Students with the same reading needs are put in groups and taken care of by all the grade 1 teachers. Every Mondays and Thursdays in period 3, students get into their reading groups and teachers explicitly teach the students according to their needs. We are assisted by our hardworking grade 1 educational assistants.

The reading group in 1JT consists of students reading on levels 20 and beyond. Our focus is on vocabulary, applied meaning and knowledge as well as comprehension|

We are so excited to take you on this unforgettable journey into our natural world, the dwelling place of all living things, all very unique and exotic. We have learnt that;

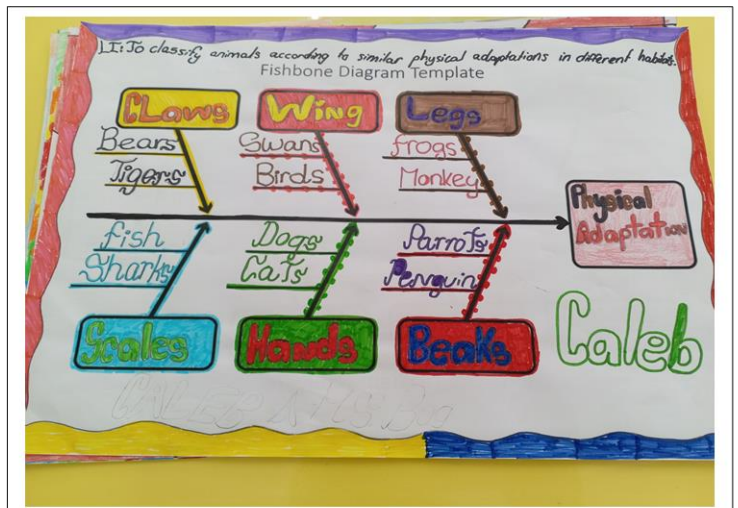
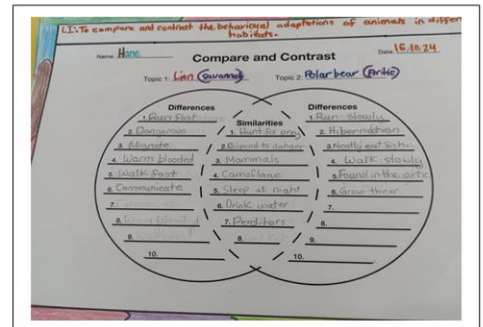

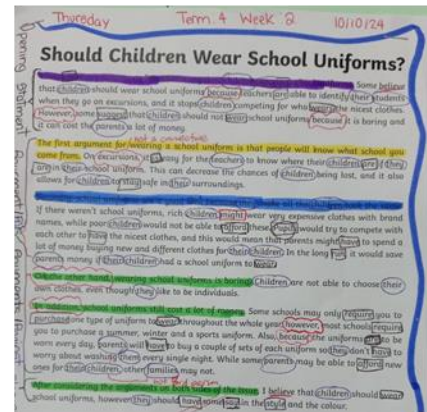

During our student-led conference, students proudly explain their tasks and learning progress to their parents, showcasing their hard work and growth.

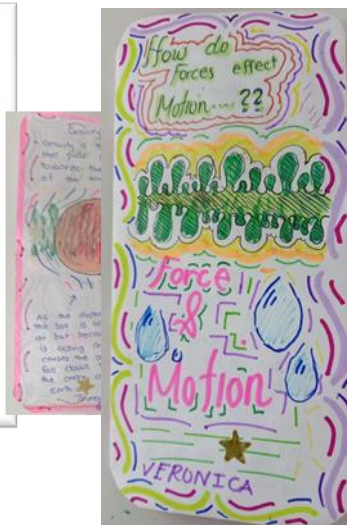


Here are some exciting highlights from 6SA's Classroom

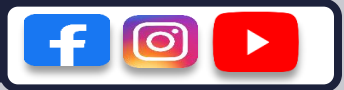
