




ENGINEERING PATHWAY

COMPUTER SCIENCE PATHWAY

What to expect in this pathway:






BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE PATHWAY

What to expect in this pathway:

- class activities <u>connect learning to life</u> as students investigate topics including human medicine, physiology, genetics, microbiology, and public health.
- students work in teams to find unique solutions, and in the process, learn in-demand, transferable skills like critical thinking and communication



FIRST CLASS: PRINCIPLES OF BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE HONORS

PBSH is taken INSTEAD of Biology/H in 9th grade! Class is not exactly harder than Biology H, but it is more work based on labs!

Completion of one of the three previous pathways, along with some additional classes, can lead to the International Baccalaureate® (IB) Career-related Programme (CP)!

- The IBCP prepares students for the world of work, as well as developing a student's personal qualities.
- By doing so it leads students down a personally chosen pathway towards further/higher education, apprenticeships or work.
- Students in the CP develop skills that are genuinely valued by employers.
 The programme's curriculum framework develops:

linguistic proficiency maturity and responsibility a strong work ethic critical thinking skills time management skills social and communication skills.



- Students should select English Honors and Biology H or PBSH for the 9th grade year as well as a Modern Language.





cannot occur on semester final exam days.


