TIMELINE

May 2023 Superintendent's Conference Day

- met with classroom teachers, reading specialists and special education teachers grades 4-6
- discussed vocabulary instruction, standards and morphology as a research-based strategy to teach vocabulary
- foundation for work in the 2023-2024 schoolyear
- Fall 2023 Professional Development

Spelling lists start with words that are easier to spell and understand. The words get more difficult further down the list. This allows teachers to have students who struggle focus on the words at the beginning of the list and students who excel to focus on words at the end of the list. Students are exposed to the same words and are learning the same concepts but they are responsible for spelling different words.

CONTENT/TEACHING

- So much better than traditional spelling
- It was a lot at the beginning of the year (exhausting)

- Appreciate that the instruction is systematic, not random words on a list

Our students are becoming word detectives! They are not trying to memorize a list. They are learning morphemes (small parts of words with meaning). When they see an unfamiliar word, they can use the parts they know to help them figure out the meaning.



UNIVERSAL PREKINDERGARTEN (UPK)

UPDATE ON THE 2024-2025 UPK PROGRAM

- Two (2) sections of In-House UPK with eighteen (18) students in each section. One (1) section is at Ostrander Elementary School and the other section is at Plattekill Elementary School.
- We have contracted with two (2) outside agencies; Building Blocks Childcare, Inc. and Most Precious Blood (MPB)
 - Building Blocks has eight (8) students
 - MPB has forty (40) students
- Teachers are using Play Based Learning to teach the <u>focus skills</u> (standards) for prekindergarten in the following developmental domains:
 - Character Education/Communication, Language and Literacy/Cognition and Knowledge of the World/Physical Development

2025-2026 UPK TIMELINE

- Applications for the 2025-2026 UPK lottery will be available on April 25, 2025, and are due by Friday, May 23, 2025.
- The district will hold a random lottery to determine enrollment on Thursday, June 5, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. Any student not selected in the lottery for a seat will be placed on a waiting list.
- District transportation WILL NOT be provided for the program.
- The aid that the district receives does not cover the full cost to run the program.
- The UPK program is contingent upon the passing of the 2025-2026 school budget on Tuesday,
 May 20, 2025.
