Requirements:

1. Candidates must be actively and positively involved in **AT LEAST ONE** on-campus sport, club, or academic program. Advisor/Coach of the program must sign below confirming your involvement. Signature also indicates positive recommendation as a Prom Court candidate. Organization involvement will be included on ballot only if advisor/coach signature is present.

2. If voted as a member of Prom Court, you will be required to participate in **ALL** Prom activities. Details will be discussed at the meeting. Ticket to Prom will be reduced to **\$80** for Court members. Please wait to purchase your ticket until after Prom Court has been announced to avoid the need to issue a partial refund.

3. All school and district rules, policies, dress code, and Prom Nominee Contract Rules apply to all aspects of Prom.

4. Any suspension during the current school year or other disciplinary action occurring between nomination and Prom will disqualify you from participating. A minimum 2.0 GPA is also required.

5. During campaigning and voting week, candidates may not collect student log-in information to vote for other students. Additionally, candidates may not use their cell phones during school hours to allow other students a chance to vote. Each student should have the opportunity to vote privately for the candidate of their choice. If more than 5 votes are tracked from a specific IP address, votes will be discarded and the candidate may be disqualified.

6. All social media postings and campaign materials should be "candidate positive" and direct students to vote at quartz.voting4schools.com.

7. Students will run for the position of King or Queen. The winners will have the option to receive a non-binary title of "Royalty." If you choose the title "Royalty," you must let the Junior Class advisor (Mrs. Estrada) know ahead of time.

QHHS Campaigning/Publicity Contract (Revised Jan 2024)

Allowable Campaign Procedures:

- Video Advertisements (posted/shared from your personal social media account)
- ¼ Sheet Flyers (with Activities Office approval stamp) may be handed out
- 8 ½” x 11” flyer may be created and submitted to ASB Election Committee
 - ASB Election Committee will make copies of this flyer and post for all candidates
 - Upload the flyer at <https://bit.ly/QHHSElectionFlyer> or bring a copy to ASB Room
- Advertise on your own social media account(s)
- Creative word-of-mouth publicity and campaigning

NOT ALLOWED Campaign Procedures:

- No Food/Drink items may be given out by the candidate or supporters of the candidate
- No items may be given out by the candidate or supporters of the candidate (including, but not limited to bracelets, pencils, toys, stickers, etc.)

Additional information:

- After completing 8 ½” X 11” flyer, bring a master copy to Room 102 or upload to <https://bit.ly/QHHSElectionFlyer> and the Election Committee will approve, stamp, copy, and hang for you. Flyer is due the Friday before campaigning begins.
- Candidates will supply their own sign-making materials
- Although posters larger than 8 ½” X 11” are not allowed, you can make a “picture frame” for students to take pictures with to advertise.
- Before running copies of ¼ sheet flyers, have the master copy approved in room 102 with the “Activities Office” stamp
- All flyers and digital publicity must reflect good taste and be “candidate-positive”
- There must not be any denouncing of another candidate on any advertising material.
- Violations by any students, candidates included, of these rules and regulations may result in ordinary school disciplinary action and possible disqualification from the election.
- If non-approved posters or flyers are seen being hung up, there is a chance of you being **disqualified**
- During campaigning and voting week, candidates may not collect student log-in information to vote for other students. Additionally, candidates may not use their cell phones during school hours to allow other students a chance to vote. Each student should have the opportunity to vote privately for the candidate of their choice. **If a large number of votes are tracked from a specific IP address, candidates may be disqualified or votes may be discarded**
