# **Principal's Announcement on Updated BVSD Cell Phone Policy**

#### Dear Fairview Students and Families,

I hope your semester is off to a great start! As we continue to build a positive and distraction-free learning environment, I want to take a moment to remind everyone about the BVSD's updated cell phone policy, which will be **fully implemented starting February 3rd**. In November, BVSD's Board of Education voted to update the district's cell phone policy, and beginning in January, students are



expected to keep their phones away during school hours while on campus. This includes passing periods, lunch, and free periods. I want to stress that this is not a cell phone ban, but rather a policy designed to minimize distractions and help strengthen the social-emotional well-being of our students by encouraging more face-to-face connections.

We know how integral phones can be for various tasks, but we also understand the need to strike a balance between their benefits and fostering a learning environment where students can focus and build healthy, in-person relationships. As such, we will be enforcing the following expectations moving forward:

- Keep cell phones off and away for the entire school day. This includes classrooms (unless directed by a teacher) and all non-classroom areas such as the library, lunchroom, Student Center, hallways, and offices.
- Phones may be stored at home, in your backpack, locker, or vehicle—but must be kept out of sight and not in use.
- If you need to contact or be contacted by a parent or guardian, they can reach you via your BVSD email or contact the main office in case of an emergency.
- Should a student fail to meet this expectation, we will follow our classroom consequences, and cell phones will be confiscated and taken to the office.

As a reminder, students will still be allowed to use their phones under the following circumstances:

- When off campus for lunch or free periods.
- When permitted by a teacher for instructional purposes.
- In case of an emergency, with permission from a teacher or staff member.

Thank you for your cooperation as we work together to create a distraction-free, community-focused environment here at Fairview High. Let's make the most of the second semester and continue building a positive, connected school culture.


Volunteers needed: Judge @ FHS Speech & Debate tournament

## **District News**

### Reduce Emissions - Turn off Your Car While Waiting

BVSD buses turn off instead of idling while waiting for students. You can too! Because vehicle idling is a significant source of air pollution, BVSD has an operating procedure that prohibits buses



and transportation support vehicles from idling for more than 5 minutes within any given 1 hour period.\* Although it is tempting to keep cars and buses running, especially during colder weather, please turn off vehicles while waiting to pick up students. (\*An exception to this is Food Service vehicles with refrigeration that need to remain on to maintain food quality).

Reduzca las emisiones - Apague su vehículo mientras espera

Los autobuses del BVSD se apagan en vez de dejarlos al ralentí mientras esperan a los estudiantes. ¡Usted también puede hacerlo! Debido a que el ralentí de los vehículos es una fuente significativa de contaminación del aire, el BVSD tiene un procedimiento de operación que prohíbe que los autobuses y los vehículos de apoyo de transporte estén en ralentí por más de 5 minutos dentro de cualquier período de 1 hora.\* Aunque es tentador mantener los vehículos y autobuses encendidos, especialmente durante el clima más frío, por favor apague los autos mientras espera para recoger a los estudiantes. (\*Una excepción a esto son los vehículos del Servicio Alimenticio con refrigeración que necesitan permanecer encendidos para mantener la calidad de los alimentos).
