High School Calendar Push Notifications

Many of you have noticed that we have many great activities happening at our school daily. We recognize this can make finding what you are most interested in difficult. If you are interested in setting push notifications for specific high school activities, please follow the instructions below.

- 1. Navigate to the High School Calendar: https://www.foxriverclassicconference.com/public/genie/207/school/3/
- 2. On the right side of the screen, under the calendar, click on the Notify Me tab.
- 3. If you haven't created an account, you will be prompted to create one so the system knows where to send the push notifications.
- 4. Once your account is set up, you will be asked to choose the activities you are interested in receiving push notifications for.
- 5. Once your notifications are set, choose when you would like to receive the notifications and click save.

You are all set. Revisit the calendar to adjust your notifications as needed.

Bird's Nest and Birdfeeder Snack Cart

The Birds Nest, in the high school Back Commons, is <u>OPEN</u> for breakfast from 6:30am-7:40am. They have a daily breakfast special, coffee, lattes, fruit, cereal, and other great items to start your day off great! High school students and staff, come check it out!

School Nutrition also has the Birdfeeder Snack Cart that is delivered to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd hour study halls.

Lunch and Lunch Release

Students- If you leave for lunch, you cannot return into the building until lunch is done and our staff lets you back in the building. The weather is only going to get colder, so please be vigilant of this before you leave on a very cold day or when the snow starts to fly.

Also, if you are in need of a new student ID, stop in the main high school office at pay \$7.00 (cash or check) and one will be printed for you.

Lastly, if you do **<u>NOT</u>** have lunch release <u>you are **NOT** allowed to leave the building for lunch</u>. The lunch release is on our Annual OLR, but <u>can be updated by a parent/guardian calling the main high school office</u>.

Hope Squad

Hope Squad is a school-based peer support team, made up of students who are nominated by their peers, that partners with local mental health agencies. Research shows that children and young adults who are contemplating suicide are more likely to reach out to their peers than the adults in their lives. In this way, Hope Squad members are the "eyes and ears" of the school building – monitoring for warning signs of suicide



and helping to connect their peers with staff members who can offer the appropriate resources in times of need. The Unified School District of De Pere has Hope Squad teams at Foxview, DPMS, and DPHS.

Teens can obtain a permit in WI at age 15.

- Teens will not be allowed to apply for their probationary license until they are at least 16 years old, hold their permit for at least 6 months ticket free, practice hours of at least 50 hours and 10 of those at night, and have completed all of driver education (classroom and BTW lessons).
- Another change is that the **permit will be good for 18 months** instead of 12 months. All 16-17 year olds **will have to take the road test.**
- The new law changes the number of practice hours required during the permit phase, it changed from **30** hours to **50** hours. The DMV does not collect the practice driving record when teens go for their road test however they may ask to see it or the **Road Ready app** which also tracks practice time.
- Your teen should work toward at least 100 hours of practice with 30 of those at night based on national recommendations put forth by AAA Foundation research in order to give novice drivers more experience before licensing (shows it reduces crashes after licensing). Our common goal for everyone is to have fewer crashes, injuries, and fatalities involving teens and all other drivers. Use of the Road Ready app is a great tool for them to track their progress of practice hours.

Who is eligible to enroll? Any student who is 14 years/10 months to 18 years old. Sign up information is located on the De Pere High School webpage under the "Students" tab under the Driver's Education link. You could also go to http://cesa2.com to access information regarding Driver's Education at De Pere High School.


