

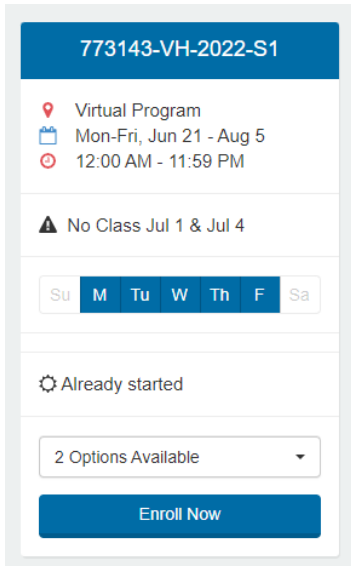

2025 High School Summer School

FAQs

Q: I don't understand the dates on Eleyo. What is the difference between the sessions?

A: When viewing the VIRTUAL courses on Eleyo, they are listed for the entire summer (see image below). Virtual courses are open to students 24/7. Students must follow the Virtual Courses Schedule in order to determine when during the summer they will be taking courses.



Q: What classes can I take?

A: Based on the new Michigan Merit Curriculum standards required by the State of Michigan, students are limited to select only from an appropriate category of course offerings based on their scheduled graduation date. **Students must review their summer school selections with their school counselor or administrator before registering.** The counselor or administrator signature does not indicate a recommendation for enrollment. Final enrollment decisions are up to the student and parents. Reach out to counselors before school ends for summer.

CLASSES THAT ARE 1/2 CREDIT (1/2 CREDIT = 1 SEMESTER), BOTH SEMESTERS ARE NEEDED IN ORDER TO FULFILL THE YEAR CREDIT.

Example: If your student needs to take Algebra 1, they need to take S1 and S2 in order to gain the year credit in the course. Only taking Algebra 1 S1 will give them ½ credit in the course.

Contact office during registration for approval of NCAA courses.

Q: Can I take PE and 1 virtual course at the same time? How does the schedule work?

A: Students are allowed to take 1 full credit in the summer. PE (0.5 credits) and an additional virtual course (0.5 credits) can be taken together to reach the 1 credit maximum. Students may not exceed the 1 credit maximum. Students will follow the virtual schedule for their one virtual course and the in person PE schedule for their PE course. Please be sure to let your mentor teacher know you are also taking an in person course so they are aware you are taking more than one summer course.

Example: If your PE course is in the first session you will begin that course June 16th. You will also have access to your virtual course that will open June 16th. Your PE course will then finish July 10 and you will have until July 30 to complete your virtual course. Contact your virtual mentor teacher and they will help adjust your course dates if you wish to start your virtual course later.

Q: I'm going on vacation, what is the attendance policy for in-seat classes (PE)?

A: The following attendance policy is in place for students enrolled in Summer School Physical Education:

1. **Maximum Absences:** Students are allowed a maximum of 2.5 days of absences for the duration of the summer session. At 3 absences students will be dropped.

- **Excessive Absences:** If a student exceeds 2.5 days of absence, they may be subject to the following consequences:

- **Potential Failure:** An "E" will be placed on the report card if the student exceeds 2.5 days of absences after the first five days of classes. No grade will be recorded for a class drop within the first 5 days.

- **No Make-Up Classes:** Due to the condensed nature of the summer session, make-up classes will not be available.

2. **Tardiness and ½ Absences**

- Start of class: 1-10 minutes late is a tardy
 - 11 minutes or more is ½ an absence
- End of break: 1-5 minutes late is a tardy
 - 6 minutes or more is ½ an absence
- **3 tardies equals a full absence.**

3. **Excused Absences:** There are NO excused absences. There are NO exceptions.

Please communicate all absences **DURING** summer school with your student's summer school teacher.

Q: I'm going on vacation, what is the schedule? Can I still take virtual classes?

A: You will receive a pacing calendar from your virtual instructor in the first week of the program which allows you to monitor and keep track of your progress. Students will need to allow for additional hours per day they are at home if they are unable to access a computer during a vacation period. Students will receive reminders from their assigned instructor if they fall behind during the program. As long as a student has access to a computer with internet, they may take classes virtually from anywhere. Students must be able to stay on track and complete their courses by the dates listed in the Program Schedule. All final exams are virtual.

Q: How do I drop or transfer a class?

A: All drops and transfers must be done with written notice to Katie Hancock (Summer School Secretary) at khancock@troy.k12.mi.us. Please note there is a \$20 processing fee per class drop, change, or transfer. *Refer to HSSS Policies for in-seat and virtual refund dates.*

Q: My child is transferring to another school, what do we do with our credits?

A: Always speak with your student's counselor prior to signing up for any summer school courses. You must determine if your credits from Troy can transfer to the school in which your child will be attending, either IAE East or out of district. The drop and transfer policy will still apply to these situations.

Q: Math Test out question. My student is trying to test out of Algebra 1 (example), what do I do?

A: Always speak with your student's counselor prior to signing up for any summer school courses. There are different options:

1. Sign up for the course your child hopes to be in after the test out
2. Sign up for the course your child will be in if they do not pass the test out
3. Wait until you have the test out results as virtual classes do not fill and there will be spaces available for your child

We do not have access to math test out results. You will need to contact your child's home school for results.

Please note there is a \$20 processing fee per class drop, change, or transfer.

Q: What is the schedule for summer school?

A: In seat PE -

Session 1: Monday, June 16 – Thursday, July 10

(NO SCHOOL July 3 and July 7)

Session 2: Friday, July 11 – Friday, August 1

Q: Where do I go on the first day of in-seat class (PE)?

A: Prior to the first day of PE, a welcome letter will be emailed to all students/parents with details about the upcoming session. It will also be posted to the Summer School Google Drive (link at troyceonline.com). On the first day of class, students will meet their instructor at 7:50am in the Troy High School gym. There will be a list posted so students are able to find their instructor.

Q: Does my child need to know how to swim?

A: Teachers will help with the basic understanding of swimming and assist them in the pool. They have kick boards and such for students who need them. They will also be placed in a lane at the edge of the pool if they need the wall for assistance. Teachers will be monitoring students who need assistance.

Q: How do I login to my virtual class?

A: Virtual courses will open June 16, 2025 - All program information will be available in the Summer School Google Drive (link at troyceonline.com/programs/hsss). Please check your registration confirmation for details. NOTE: Please check your email junk folder for registration confirmation or contact the summer school office via email for Eleyo account corrections.

Q: I'm having trouble logging in, what do I do?

A: For questions or issues with Edgenuity/account login issues, please email Jeff Williams (Summer School Principal) at jwilliams@troy.k12.mi.us.

Q: I'm trying to contact my mentor teacher but haven't heard back. How do I reach them?

A: Mentor teachers will correspond with students via Edgenuity. Be sure to provide accurate student email when registering.

Q: How do I take my final?

A: Students will follow a detailed virtual program schedule as outlined on page 3. Students who have completed the sequential material in their class will have the opportunity to take their final exam between the hours of 8am to 12pm, Monday through Friday as set up with their mentor teacher. Students needing to take their final exam on the last day, will need to wait until their teacher has reviewed their course material and opened the exam.

There will be NO extensions given. No retakes given. Any student who is unable to take their final exam will receive a zero on the exam and will receive a grade that includes that score in their final average.

Q: How much is the final exam worth, and can I get an A+ grade?

A: The final exam for ALL virtual courses is worth 30% of the final semester grade. Additionally, there are no A+ grades in summer school. The maximum grade is an A grade.

Q: What happens if I am suspected of plagiarism?

A: Software utilized in the summer program will notify teachers when plagiarized or AI assisted work is suspected by students. Mentor teachers will review the assignment and determine whether further evaluation or student/parent contact would be warranted. Summer School Principal may require in person evaluation of work if multiple violations are suspected.

If use of AI is confirmed, students will receive a zero on assignment and parent notification. Further attempts to submit work that is confirmed as assisted in any way will result in course being dropped with no credit and no refund.

1st offense: a zero on assignment and parent notification.

2nd offense: drop of course (s) with no refund.

Q: When will I get my report card?

A: Report cards for in-district students can be found in the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Grades for out-of-district students will be sent to the student's district guidance office in August. Students should advise their counselors when they meet in the fall semester that they took classes in summer school.
