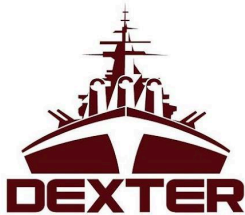
The AER is available for you to review electronically by visiting the following website [Creekside Intermediate School AER](#), or you may review a copy in the main office at your child's school.

For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

In our ongoing pursuit of academic excellence, our school is actively implementing key initiatives to accelerate student achievement and address persistent gaps. Additionally, targeted interventions and support systems are in place to provide assistance where needed. We are committed to fostering a learning environment that is inclusive and equitable, striving to eliminate disparities in achievement. 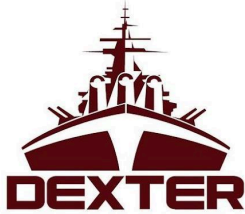

1. The Dexter Community Schools are organized by grade-level bands on one central campus. All Fourth and Fifth Grade students are assigned to Creekside Intermediate School.

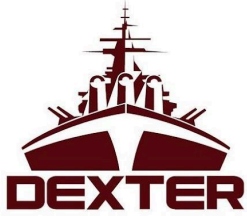
