### Crisis & Advocacy Services

**24/7 Crisis Line - If a student needs crisis intervention or stabilization from a Designated Crisis Responder (DCR), call 1-888-910-0416.** The family will be assisted by Volunteers of America then forwarded to Kitsap Mental Health Services DCR. DCRs have the ability to detain people (ages 13+) against their will for imminent danger to self/others or for grave disability due to a mental illness. DCRs cannot detain a person who is agreeable to voluntary treatment.

If a student needs crisis intervention or stabilization, or would just like someone to talk to, they can **call 988 or text "help" to 988** and they will be directed to the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline. There are options for LGBTQIA + (option 3 or respond with "Y" to text prompt) and Indigenous students (Native & Strong, Option 4).

**Youth Mobile Crisis Outreach Crisis Team (YMCOT) -** If a student needs crisis interventions and connection to community resources; please call **1-888-910-0416 and request the YMCOT.** Any student can use this service UNLESS they're already in the WISe program. School professionals can also call this number to consult, request a mobile outreach team to come to school, request follow up for students, and explore inpatient bed availability. This is a great option if a student is dysregulated at school but is stable enough to engage in safety planning instead of seeking immediate treatment. They are also available for consultation and resource referrals. YMCOT offers home visits and provides crisis stabilization for up to 14 days.

This free, telephone-based referral service is funded by Washington Healthcare Authority and operated by Seattle Children's. The Mental Health Referral Service will provide thorough mental health referrals for children and teens 17 and younger from across Washington.

Families can call **833-303-5437** or submit an [online request form](#). They will schedule a telephone intake with a Family Advocate Case Manager, who will ask for the patient's information, including their mental health needs, location, and health insurance plan. After provider matches are found, the Case Manager will call and email the family to access providers or agencies in real-time. The same Case Manager will follow up with the family after a few weeks to ensure an appointment was made, provide any additional resources, and discuss any barriers there may have been.
