

AP APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Courses labeled "AP" are Advanced Placement courses designed to prepare students for the College Board Advanced Placement examinations. They are the equivalent of college level courses, and taking the AP examination (an additional fee of approximately \$100 per test) is required. AP exam fees are collected in the Fall of the year the class will be taken and must be paid through the CCHS online store.

In order to enroll in an AP course, a student must be placed in the course according to departmental guidelines (Noted in the curriculum guide). Enrollment in AP courses is not automatic. Student performance, assertiveness in class, maturity, level of commitment in prerequisite classes, performance on standardized tests, possible entrance evaluations, and teacher recommendations are factors considered for most classes. All deadlines must be met for a student to be considered.

Applicants who have not been placed in an AP class may petition an appeal process regarding placement. The appeal must be filed by the student to subjects Department Chair by April 11, and a placement decision will be determined by May 9. New information (improved grades, updated standardized tests, extraordinary circumstances, etc.) will be asked by the department to indicate what factors have changed to be considered in the placement decision.

To Apply:

- All completed AP Course Applications are due by 12:00 PM on Friday, February 28, 2025, through the online application.
