To make it easier, we have a leaflet available at the school reception detailing the contacts and procedures for seeking support or making a referral for your child. If you need any further information or have specific questions, please don't hesitate to speak to Mrs Moore, who can offer guidance and assistance. Together, we can ensure that our children receive the support they need to thrive, both academically and emotionally.
