

New CCP Student Information Checklist

Criteria for Participation

Interested students and their parents should follow the steps below to determine eligibility to participate in CCP.

1. Attend an information session (February 13, 2025) and sign and date the Information session Confirmation (pink paper)
2. Complete the Intent form (yellow paper) and return to the high school on or before April 1, 2025. **(This will need to be completed annually)**
3. Complete online CCP application.
4. Complete a mature content permission slip (blue paper) with a parent signature.
5. Request that **Mrs. Jurick send your transcript to the college of choice.**
6. Determine eligibility and placement:
 - Students entering grades 10, 11 or 12 with an unweighted, cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or above will be admitted into the CCP program. If the student does not have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, a placement test will need to be scheduled with the college.
7. If you will be taking the ACCUPLACER test*, review the free resources available on our test preparation website.
8. ***Please watch your email!*** Once accepted, complete the CCP orientation
9. Schedule an appointment to meet with Mrs. Jurick to select classes and register for classes.

***To participate in math courses through CCP, students must have successfully completed Algebra 2 and placed into college-level math.**

Student Accommodation Center

Lakeland Community College is committed to providing CCP students equal access to learning opportunities. If you wish to receive academic accommodations for CCP courses and have them guaranteed to be in place from the beginning of your initial semester, it is recommended that you request your accommodations from Lakeland's SAC at least four weeks before that term. From then on, you will be asked to make your accommodation requests known for subsequent semesters during the priority registration period. If you miss priority registration, there may be a delay in getting your accommodations in place. Academic accommodations can be requested at any point in the academic term, however, accommodations cannot be applied retroactively and some accommodations may take additional time to put into place.
