### A. EXECUTIVE SESSION

The Board convened into Executive Session at 6:32 pm Per ORS 192.660(2)(i) to review and evaluate the performance of the chief executive officer or any other public officer, employee or staff member, unless the person whose performance is being reviewed and evaluated requests an open hearing.

### B. REGULAR SESSION

1. **Call to Order:** The Regular Session of the Philomath School District Board of Directors was called to order by Board Chair Rick Wells at 7:03 pm on January 9, 2025 at the Philomath High School Community Conference Room located at 2054 Applegate Street. Those in attendance included Philomath School District Board of Directors Rick Wells, Joe Dealy, Sandi Hering, Erin Gudge, and Ryan Cheeke; Superintendent Susan Halliday; Business Manager Jennifer Griffith; Executive Assistant Michele McRae. Joe Dealy joined the meeting via Zoom, and he left the meeting at 8:26 pm.

i. **Pledge of Allegiance:** Director Gudge led us in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ii. **Approval of Consent Agenda:** Director Hering moved to approved the Consent Agenda as presented. Director Gudge seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved. Motion passes 5-0.

iii. **Request for Agenda Modifications**

2. **Public Comment:** There were no public comments.

### C. REPORTS

1. **Student Government Report:** No report.

2. **Association Reports**

i. **PEA:** Nichole Stueve, PEA Co-President, reported that it's good to see everyone back at school. They are getting ready for the upcoming bargaining season. There are still some safety issues and technology issues that they are working on.

ii. **OSEA:** No report.

3. **School Stuff:** No report

4. **Superintendent's Report:**

- i. Superintendent Halliday acknowledged the Philomath School District Board of Directors and the work that they do for students. She read a proclamation from Oregon Governor Tina Kotek honoring School Board Members for their dedication to students.
  - ii. The calendar committee met today and came to a consensus about the 25-26 calendar, and it is ready to be adopted tonight.
  - iii. Senate Bill 5506 for special education stipends information was submitted to ODE today. There are 58 Philomath School District staff who qualify for the stipend which will be distributed in the June payroll.
  - iv. The Center for Educational Leadership met with the administration and some teachers to work on group development. They will meet again in April.
  - v. The LBL-ESD Local Service Plan is in the packet for approval.
  - vi. District Equity Committees need to be implemented by this September.
  - vii. The Technology Department set up the new phone system over the winter break. It was a huge undertaking to have everything set up before the end of the break, and they did a great job!
  - viii. There was an underground water leak at the elementary school. The Facilities Department was able to fix it before school started on January 6<sup>th</sup>.
  - ix. Staff members are volunteering for the safety committees.
5. **Financial Report:** The financial statements were included in the Board packet. Enrollment is holding steady, but it's still lower than estimated. The Oregon Department of Education will recalculate the state school fund in February or March, so if there's an adjustment for the District, Jennifer will know after the recalculation. The audit documents are all back from the auditors, and the auditors will be at the February Board Meeting to present. The District is predicting a slight decrease in enrollment for next year based on birth rates and outgoing class sizes being larger than incoming class sizes.

#### D. STRATEGY AND DISCUSSION

- 1. **Board Liaison Assignments:** Superintendent Halliday presented the list of Board Liaison Assignments. Each school has a Board member representative, and the committees have Board representation. Director Gudge said that she is concerned that they could still be in negotiations with PEA when three Board members' terms end.
- 2. **Cell Phone Surveys:** Superintendent Halliday shared the Cell Phone Survey results from parents, students and staff. In the parent survey, the majority of parents agreed that cell phones have a negative effect on learning, and they agreed that students shouldn't be using their phones during school. 55 percent of parents believe that students should be able to have their cell phones during breaks. 90 percent of teachers believe that cell phones have a negative effect on students. The majority of students did not think that cell phones have a negative effect on their education. There will be a meeting next week with the administration to talk about a plan.
- 3. **19<sup>th</sup> Street Construction:** Superintendent Halliday explained how the night time road construction will affect road use between the Philomath schools.

4. **2025-2026 Proposed School Year Calendar:** Superintendent Halliday reported that all of the representatives from the calendar committee shared the draft calendar with their groups and schools, and the consensus is that people are happy with the calendar. Director Cheeke moved to approve the 2025-2026 school year calendar as presented. Director Gudge seconded the motion, and the Board approved it unanimously. Motion passes 4-0, with one member absent.
5. **Board Work Session Agenda:** Superintendent Halliday referred to the action plan that was put together by OSBA after the Board’s self-evaluation. She said that one of the items on their plan is the strategic plan, so they’ll talk about that at the work session. Director Gudge pointed out that item 2 on the action plan is to identify someone who can facilitate the strategic plan. Director Gudge would like a shared Board calendar.

**E. DISCUSSION & ACTION ITEMS**

1. **OSBA Voting:** Director Wells reported that during the OSBA voting at the December Board Meeting, the Board members did not read their votes out loud for OSBA Board of Directors, Position 10; OSBA Legislative Policy Committee, Position 10, Resolution #1 – Amends OSBA Dues Schedule; Resolution #2 – Creates the OSBA Pride Caucus & Designated Seat on the OSBA Board; Resolution #3 – Adopts Proposed Amendments to OSBA Bylaws. Each Board member read their votes. Director Wells voted for Clyde Rood, Jason Curtis, Yes for Resolution #1, No for Resolution #2, and Yes for Resolution #3. Director Gudge voted for Luhui Whitebear, Jason Curtis, Yes for Resolution #1, Yes for Resolution #2, and Yes for Resolution #3. Director Dealy voted for Luhui Whitebear, Jason Curtis, Yes for Resolution #1, Yes for Resolution #2, and Yes for Resolution #3. Director Hering voted for Luhui Whitebear, she abstained from the OSBA Legislative Policy Committee vote, Yes for Resolution #1, No for Resolution #2, and Yes for Resolution #3. Director Cheeke voted for Clyde Rood, Jason Curtis, Yes for Resolution #1, No for Resolution #2, and Yes for Resolution #3.
2. **Approval of Budget Calendar:** Director Gudge moved to adopt the 2025-2026 Budget Calendar as presented. Director Hering seconded the motion, and the Board approved it unanimously. Motion passes 5-0.

Director Dealy moved to approve the policies as presented. Director Gudge seconded the motion, and the Board approved them unanimously. Motion passes 5-0.

4. **Approval of 2025-2027 LBL-ESD Local Service Plan**

i. Superintendent Halliday said that this is our support plan from the Linn Benton Lincoln Education Service District, and it is adopted every two years. Each district that contracts the ESD’s services is able to give input on the plan. Director Gudge moved to approve the 2025-2027 LBL ESD Local Service Plan. Director Cheeke seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously by the Board. Motion passes 5-0.

5. **Resolution #2425-02:** The Resolution is in the Board packet, and it restates that people would not be able to enter a school to ask questions about undocumented students. A staff training document was also included in the packet. Director Dealy moved to approve the resolution as presented. Director Hering seconded motion. Motion passes 5-0. Director Dealy left the meeting at 8:26 pm.

F. **MEETING CLOSURE**

1. **Next Meeting Agenda Items:** Auditor’s presentation, KVCS presentation will take place in March; Philomath Academy report; Licensed renewals will be approved at the March Board Meeting.
2. **Board Thanks:** Director Wells thanked everyone in the District, and he congratulated the basketball teams that went to Alaska. The Superintendent in Ketchikan praised the Philomath SD teams for their outstanding sportsmanship. He thanked the staff who worked over the break to prepare for the new year. Director Gudge reported that the MS winter band program was fantastic, and that MS play practice has begun. Director Hering echoed Director Wells thanks, and she especially thanked the Technology Department for installing the phone system over the winter break. She also attended all of the winter concerts in the district, and she is so impressed with the students. She praised and thanked everyone who was involved in the winter programs.
3. **Board Requests:** Director Wells announced that he will not be running for the Board in the next election. He pointed out that someone else will need to volunteer for PEA negotiations since he will be finished on June 30<sup>th</sup>. Director Hering said that the district owes him a big thank you for his years of dedication to the students.
4. **Adjournment:** Board Chair Rick Wells adjourned the meeting at 9:03 pm.

### PSD Academic Calendar Committee:

Our committee met earlier this week, February 10<sup>th</sup>, to enter into discussions about the academic calendar for the 2026-2027 school year. We will be seeking final approval by the Board prior to the end of the current school year.

### Oregon Exclusion Day:

Oregon's School Exclusion Day is scheduled for Wednesday, February 19<sup>th</sup>. No, this is not a day when we randomly ask students not to come to school! This is the day, designated in Oregon, when children who are not up-to-date on their immunizations will be excluded from school until in compliance with requirements. Compliance means completing missing vaccinations and/or claiming exemption when appropriate.

Our nurses began sending notifications to impacted families in October 2024, with two additional notices being sent since that time. While we do not have many students on this list, there are a few. We'll keep trying to keep these students in school!

**Clemens Community Pool:**

The pool continues to be a very busy place. With the current closure of Osborn Aquatic Center, in Corvallis, we have picked up some additional individual swimmers, teams, lessons, and groups seeking facility rental.

To keep pace with additional costs, Clemens Community Pool will be slightly increasing rental rates. Such rentals involve primarily birthday parties, summer camps, and other private rentals.

The Corvallis City Council Meeting, held on February 3, 2025 included the structural engineering report outlining the extent of need prior to reopening Osborn Aquatic Center. Osborn has been given approval to reopen select indoor areas and outdoor pools temporarily. A community meeting is scheduled to take place, in Corvallis, on March 10, 2025 to discuss options.

**Career Fair @ OSU:**

High School Juniors (11<sup>th</sup> graders) will be involved in the Career Fair at OSU, scheduled for Tuesday, March 4<sup>th</sup>. Students have the opportunity to explore at least three career paths, receive feedback on their most current resume, and participate in two mock interviews.

**Cell Phones in Schools:**

Following compilation and review of survey data, the Philomath School District is banning the use of personal electronic devices during all class time—from bell to bell—with some exceptions. Cell phones and other mobile devices brought into classrooms, including Smart Phones, Flip Phones, tablets, e-readers, Smart Watches, Smart Glasses, and any other personal, web-capable device and the headphones and/or earbuds connected to these devices, are to be put away.

Exceptions include the following:

- At teacher discretion, when a full-class activity requires or encourages use.
- When indicated by an IEP or 504 plan for a student.
- When required for monitoring of personal medical condition.

At this time, personal electronic devices may remain in student possession, such as a pocket, purse, or backpack. Devices can be used during non-class time.

During the remaining months of this school year, policies will be reviewed and updated. This will include information specific to student handbooks at each school. We will also include information about similarities and differences between elementary and secondary student populations.

**Public Education @ the National Level:**

Last week, I received letter from AASA, the National School Superintendents Association. The letter highlighted several important nuggets of information to consider as we navigate the shifting landscape of public education. These statements come directly from the introduction to the AASA letter.

1. Executive orders do not create new laws, change existing ones, or provide legally binding rules for schools. Instead, they direct federal agencies on how the President wants them to enforce current laws.
2. Without action from Congress or the courts, many of the executive orders cannot directly change legal requirements for school districts.
3. Schools do not need to immediately alter their policies or practices based on executive orders alone.

### **Oregon School Boards Association:**

As requested by the Board, the District is in the process of contracting with the Oregon School Boards Association (OSBA) to assist with facilitation of our strategic planning.

### **OSBA Proposal:**

The strategic planning process for school districts, as outlined by the OSBA, is a comprehensive framework divided into Strategic Direction, Strategic Planning and Operations, and Strategic Monitoring Plan. This process begins with setting clear, collaborative goals for the future, followed by developing a strategic plan with measurable objectives aligned with those goals, and concludes with a monitoring plan to evaluate progress. Facilitated sessions ensure stakeholder involvement and adaptability to the district's needs, making it a dynamic and responsive approach to achieving educational aspirations.

### **Districtwide Leadership Team:**

The districtwide leadership team (DLT) is a group of district staff the superintendent invites to work alongside the school board to guide and support districtwide educational efforts and lead change initiatives to enhance the education culture, instructional practices, and student outcomes. Comprised of central office staff, building principals, teacher leaders, and individuals with the capacity and commitment to lead instructional initiatives, this team is tasked with setting goals, monitoring progress, and adjusting strategies based on data to ensure the success of their improvement efforts. Their work is crucial in identifying specific learning needs and engaging all staff members collectively to drive meaningful change across the district. In this strategic planning process, the superintendent will be responsible for identifying and coordinating a DLT to participate in priority setting with the board, supporting the development of the district's operational plan, and identifying key strategic indicators.

ODE will be releasing State School Fund estimates by March 1 for the 2025-26 fiscal year. ODE should also have an updated SSF estimate calculation for the current year this month as well. We are expecting a slight reduction in our SSF allocation for the current year due to the decline in enrollment.

Thank you to all that attended the Budget Committee Information session last week. It was a good kick off for the 2025-26 budget preparation season.

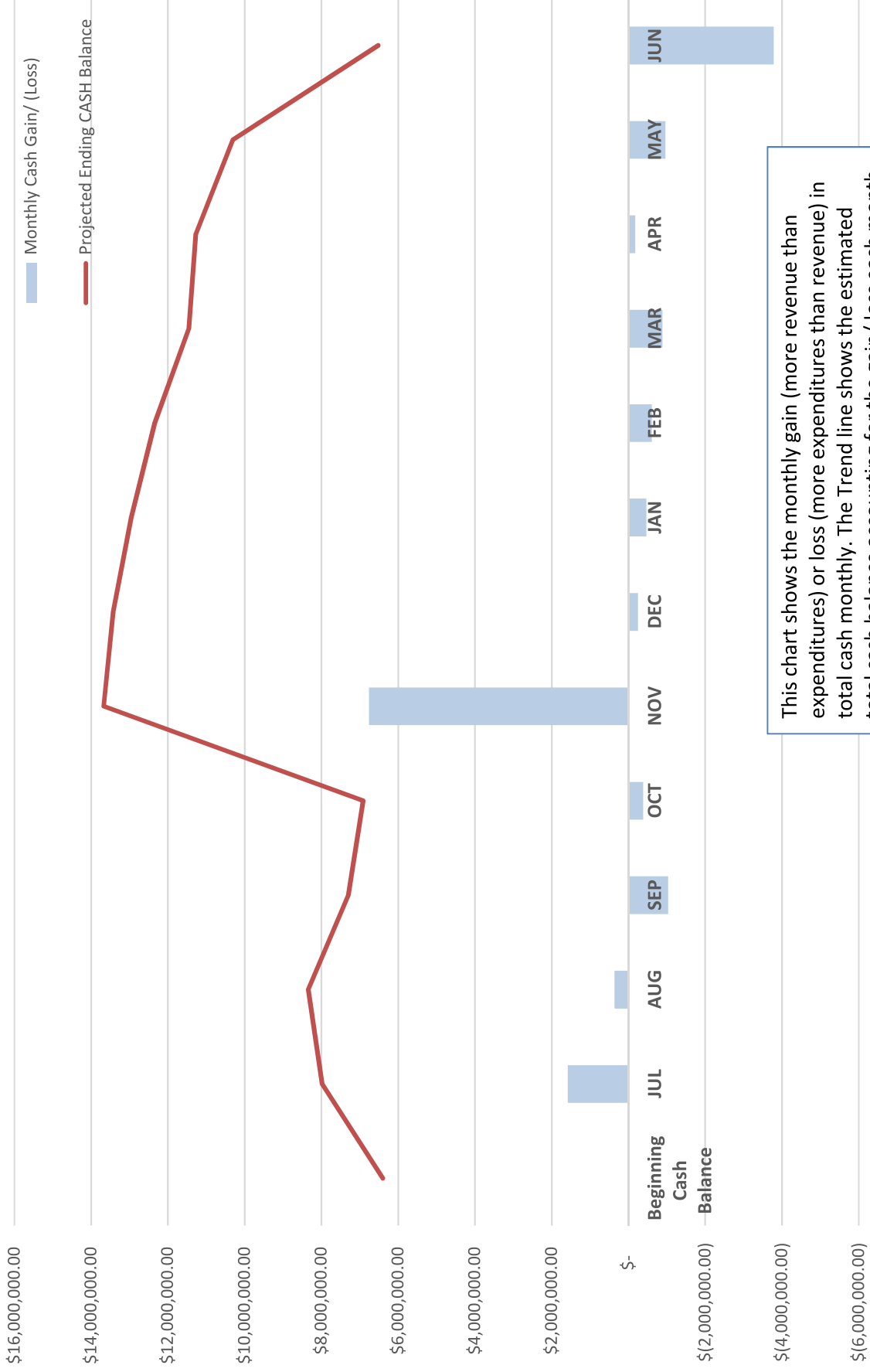
