    - a. WHEREAS, on January 13, 2025, the Board of Education of the Shelter Island Union Free School District began the 2025-2026 budget formation process which included discussion of piercing the cap; and

WHEREAS, the property tax cap law and associated regulations require school districts in New York State to notify the Office of the New York State Comptroller not later than March 1 of each year a report showing the anticipated property tax cap calculations for the coming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the property tax calculations have been presented to the Board on February 25, 2025 and are as follows:
