

Things to note before you begin:

How to select courses

- All class choices must be submitted via Google Form.
- Required classes are automatically in student schedules, so you are only choosing their math level and their electives.
- Students must choose 3 electives and 3 alternates.
- The deadline to submit is Monday, February 24th at 8AM.
- If you still have questions after you have submitted, you can come to WPHS on February 25th from 4-6PM to have your question answered by a WPHS Counselor or Administrator.


Partnering with the Counseling Department in Freshman Year
