Sixth Grade

English Language Arts with Ms. Williams, Ms. Steinhoff and Ms. Carter:

Sixth-grade readers are getting into NEW book clubs! We are reading fiction books focused on a social issue, analyzing how the issues affect the plot and characters.

In Writers Workshop, students will begin Essay Boot Camp.

Math with Mr. Klemme:

Students in Mr. Klemme's math 6 classes have been working in Unit 5 about graphing and patterns. We have been working on X,Y coordinate graphing in the 1st quadrant. We have just started looking at patterns in tables to see if we can identify an equation. Students will be going from equations to tables to graphs by the end of this unit.

Students in Mr. Klemme's Pre-Algebra classes have been looking at data. First, we've found common statistical landmarks (mean, median, mode, and range). Now we are creating displays for data. We've already made frequency tables, dot plots, histograms, and circle graphs. We will be reading and creating stem and leaf plots next.

Seventh Grade

English Language Arts with Ms. Steinhoff:

Seventh graders are beginning their big writing unit of the year! We will start off with a refresher on the writing process and the elements of plot, then move into free writes as a form of brainstorming. The final product will be either a realistic fiction or fantasy fiction piece. Check in with your student about the progress and make sure you ask to read their awesome final draft after their hard work in a few weeks.

Life Science with Ms. Dooley and Mr. Altringer:

The students are building understanding around genetics, looking at how traits pass through families; both in animals and plants.

We had the chance to isolate DNA from strawberries in lab.





American Studies with Ms. Newman:

We are wrapping up History Day in these first weeks of February. Students whose projects are chosen to advance will have more information about the Competition mid-February.

In class we are jumping back into content by exploring the Roaring 20's with all the glamour of Jazz, the automobile, the Harlem Renaissance, and Flappers. Students will be creating a 'Life' Magazine cover to show all of the large changes in US culture. Looking past the 1920's, we will examine the 1930's and the Great Depression.

Eighth Grade

Math with Mr. Hayden:

In Algebra, students are learning about different forms of linear equations and when they are useful. At the end of our last unit, students were introduced to slope-intercept form. In our new unit, we will learn about point-slope form and standard form.

We will also explore the relationship between slopes of parallel and perpendicular lines and then use that relationship to analyze polygons in the coordinate plane.

In Integrated Math, students are reviewing solving systems of linear equations and inequalities. Most students were introduced to these concepts last year, but for some, it is their first time doing this. For systems of equations, we will explore three different methods for solving them- graphing, substitution, and elimination. When we transition from systems of equations to learning about systems of linear inequalities, we will see how our solution changes from a singular point of intersection (if it exists) to an entire region of the graph.

Physical Science with Ms. Dooley and Mr. Chase:

Students continue their studies of Forces at a Distance — electromagnetic forces. We are learning how speakers work by investigating how magnets and electromagnets interact.

Social Studies with Ms. Croone: Global Studies:

Rights and Responsibilities was the theme this year for National History Day and projects are due Friday, February 7. Students have been hard at work on different types of projects-exhibits, documentaries, performances, papers, or websites. Students then have opportunity to select if they would like to be considered to advance to HD Regionals. Regionals this year will be Saturday, March 15 at Johnson High School. Stay tuned! Next up is Africa.

Breakthrough is a FREE 6-year college readiness program. Our Breakthrough summer program blends academics with summer campstyle fun for middle school students. During the school year we offer advising and enrichment through middle and high school, and provide individual college counseling once our students are in 11th grade. Our college counselors work with students to explore college options including financial aid and scholarships, and the average Breakthrough student graduates high school with financial aid in place to cover 89% of their college costs.

Breakthrough is free to the students and families we serve. Students must apply to the program, and commit to working hard and participating in Breakthrough!

Our program serves students that may have barriers to a 4-year college, and our goal is to close that gap. All of our students must meet at least ONE of the following need criteria:

- Single Parent household
- First generation to graduate college
- Identify as a race/ethnicity that is under-represented in college
- Qualify for free/reduced lunch
- Speaks a language other than English at home

For 8th grade families:

Here is some info from the Murray counselors (Justine Revermann and Stephanie Lee) as your student prepares for high school:

- Como Park 9th grade Registration: Thursday, April 10th from 5-7PM at Como Park High School
 - o Please prioritize this as your student needs to register for their high school classes.
- Roseville: Contact their enrollment office at Enrollment@isd623.org or 651-635-1626. If they are attending Roseville tell the SPPS Placement Center to take them off 9th grade SPPS enrollment.

Nearly all Murray 8th graders are automatically enrolled at Como Park High School - based on your address. If you do NOT want to attend Como, please apply to the high school of choice (you might not get transportation if it's out of your living area and might be put on a waiting list). If your student is not attending SPPS for high school (such as Roseville), please contact the SPPS placement Center (651-632-3700) and let them know where they will be going and to remove them from SPPS enrollment for next year. Most Murray students end up going to Como for high school, but another small group go to Roseville or Central, and a handful usually end up going to other high schools.

Emergency Contacts

Make a list of important phone numbers, including family members, friends and local organizations that can provide assistance. Keep this list in an easily accessible place. Please contact your school or log into your <u>Infinite</u> <u>Campus Parent Account</u> to verify and update your information.

Public Directory Information

Perschool district policy, certain information about students is public (including name, date of birth, grade and school). Parents have the right to "opt out" and make this information private. Please contact Student Records at 651-632-3764 and visit spps.org/families/student-records/student-records-your-rights for more information.

Family Plan

Discuss and create a plan with your family. Decide on a safe place to meet and how to communicate if you are separated.

Important Documents

Keep copies of important documents (e.g., pass ports, birth certificates, medical records) in a safe and access ible place. Consider storing digital copies securely online.

<u>Delegation of Parental Authority (DOPA)</u>: A DOPA is a document that allows you to designate someone to take care of your children if you are unable to do so. This person can make decisions about your child's care, custody and property. The DOPA is effective as soon as it is signed and notarized and lasts for up to one year.

El DOPA entra en vigor tan pronto como se firma y certifica ante notario y tiene una duración de hasta un año.
