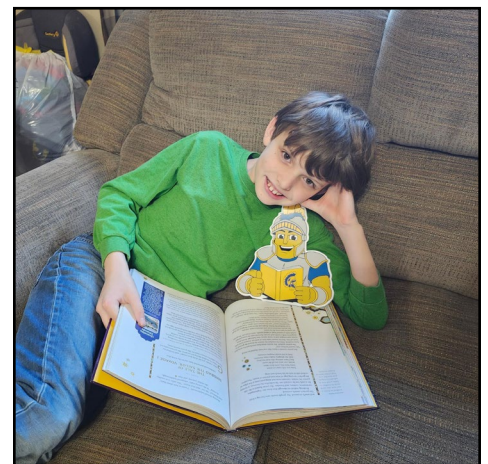

CHS bowling teams finish great season

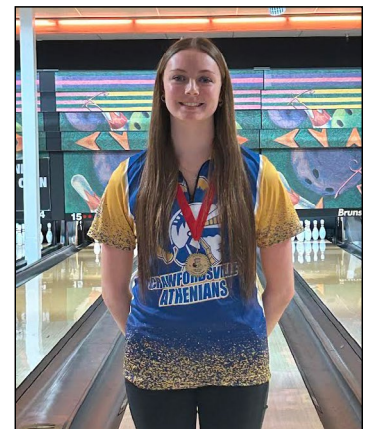
Campbell White is Semi-State Champion
