We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Parkview Elementary. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2023-24. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2023-24. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Despite our many achievements, Parkview remains focused on closely monitoring the progress of each student and addressing any existing achievement gaps. Staff meet regularly through grade level PLC meetings and data meetings held three times per year to analyze achievement data and to develop next steps. For example, we recognize gaps between students with and without disabilities, as well as the specialized support needed by students who are learning to speak English. Tier 2 interventions and individualized instruction designed to build upon student strengths provide support to students in general education classrooms. Special education and intervention staff provide additional support through scaffolding, push-in support, and focused pull-out instruction to enhance language development, as well as math and literacy achievement. Ultimately, our teachers are dedicated to differentiating instruction to meet the unique needs of every student.

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Process for Student Assignments

Novi Community Schools require proof of residency within district boundaries upon registration. Students in kindergarten through fourth grade attend one of five elementary schools, with assignments determined by geographic location.

School Improvement Plan

The Novi Community School District is actively engaged in the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Through MICIP, the district assesses the holistic needs of each student to develop comprehensive improvement plans and coordinate funding effectively.

This year marks the 2nd year of a five-year plan focused on enhancing student achievement. Key initiatives include:

- Reduce and Eliminate opportunity gaps to ensure strong academic performance for all students.
- Cultivate a safe and welcoming environment for all students and families.

School Description

Parkview has about 520 students. Approximately 66% of our students are Asian American, 20% are White, 5% are Black or African American, 4% are Multi-Ethnic, 3% are Hispanic or Latino, 1% are American Indian, and 0.4% are Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander. There are 26 home languages spoken by our students, and about 49% of our students are English Learners.

Core Curriculum

The Novi Community School District is committed to exceeding the expectations set by the Michigan State Board of Education. To ensure a strong and consistent learning experience for all students, the district utilizes the Atlas Rubicon Curriculum Maps system. This system provides a standardized framework and easy access to both the intended curriculum and the actual curriculum used for instruction. i-Ready Results

The i-Ready diagnostic assessment is administered each fall, winter, and spring to K-9 students across the district. This assessment serves as a benchmark, indicating how a student's performance in reading and math compares to grade-level peers nationally. In addition, the

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i-Ready system provides personalized learning lessons in reading and math, tailored to each student’s needs. These lessons follow a structured learning path determined by the student’s performance on the fall, winter, and spring i-Ready assessments.

Student performance on i-Ready lessons and assessments offers teachers and administrators valuable insights into meaningful data use, enabling them to apply differentiated instruction effectively for all students. At Parkview and throughout the Novi Community School District, i-Ready data is also utilized to compare and project student performance on statewide assessments.

Student results are broken into 5 levels: 1 - Mid or Above Grade Level; 2 - Early On Grade Level; 3 - One Grade Level Below; 4 - Two Grade Levels Below; and 5 - Three or More Grade Levels Below.

The median progress percentage towards annual typical growth for Parkview students in Reading was 127% with 65% meeting their goal. The median progress percentage towards annual

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stretch growth in Reading was 87% with 41% meeting their goal. Of the 471 students who participated in more than one diagnostic in the 2023-2024 school year, 72% of these students improved their placement over the school year.

The median progress percentage towards annual typical growth for Parkview students in Math was 124% with 66% meeting their goal. The median progress percentage towards annual stretch growth in Math was 89% with 42% meeting their goal. Of the 472 students who participated in more than one diagnostic in the 2023-2024 school year, 78% of these students improved their placement over the school year.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Novi Community Schools holds parent-teacher conferences twice annually. The table below shows the percentage of parents and legal guardians who participated in parent-teacher conferences at Parkview.
