We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Novi Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2023-24. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2023-24. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

In alignment with our district and school improvement plans, the NMS staff focuses on building common instructional, assessment, and grading practices that meet the needs of our learners. We use the 5D Instructional Framework to guide our discussion and growth related to high quality teaching practices. All staff set growth goals, receive observational feedback, and measure progress on goals throughout the year.

These efforts are central to creating a more equitable learning environment by fostering choice, fairness, and support for every student. Our school emphasizes the Novi POWER acronym—Perseverance, Ownership, Welcoming, Empathetic, and Respectful—as a foundation for our positive behavioral support system. Homeroom classes engage in weekly lessons focused on these principles. As a school, we integrate many grading practices in line with Ken O'Connor, Joe Feldman, and Tom Shimmer's research.

As a school, we implement Universal Accommodations in support of all learners and use summative unit assessments to track learning progress. Furthermore, we have department-based re-assessment systems in place to support learners who may need additional time to demonstrate learning at a higher level.

To track and report on student progress, we use summative unit assessments, rather than mid-term and final exams. Additionally, the NMS staff separates behavioral characteristics from academic performance by using a Novi POWER behavioral rubric, which is shared with parents on a quarterly basis to communicate student behaviors.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Process for Student Assignments

Novi Community Schools require proof of residency within district boundaries upon registration. All 7th and 8th grade students in the Novi Community School District attend Novi Middle School.

School Improvement Plan

The Novi Community School District is actively engaged in the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Through MICIP, the district assesses the holistic needs of each student to develop comprehensive improvement plans and coordinate funding effectively.

This year marks the 2nd year of a five-year plan focused on enhancing student achievement. Key initiatives include:

- Reduce and Eliminate opportunity gaps to ensure strong academic performance for all students.
- Cultivate a safe and welcoming environment for all students and families.

School Description

Novi Middle School has about 1090 students. Approximately 53% of our students are Asian American, 33% are White, 8% are Black or African American, 4% are Hispanic or Latino, 1% are American Indian, 1% are Multi-Ethnic, and 0.3% are Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander. There are 43 home languages spoken by our students, and about 15% of our students are English Learners.

Core Curriculum

The Novi Community School District is committed to exceeding the expectations set by the Michigan State Board of Education. To ensure a strong and consistent learning experience for all students, the district utilizes the Atlas Rubicon Curriculum Maps system. This system provides a standardized framework and easy access to both the intended curriculum and the actual curriculum used for instruction. Nationally Normed Achievement Assessment Data

Beginning in the 2022-2023 school year, the i-Ready diagnostic assessment is administered each fall, winter, and spring to K-9 students across the district. This assessment provides a signpost indicator as to where a student is performing in comparison to grade-level peers nationally in the areas of reading and math. The i-Ready system also provides Personalized Learning lessons for reading and math to students. These lessons follow an established learning path that is determined by student performance on the fall, winter, and spring i-Ready assessments. Student performance on i-Ready lessons and assessments provides teachers and administrators with a means to contextually increase their knowledge of meaningful data use and its application to differentiated instruction for all students. Novi Middle School and the Novi Community School District also use i-Ready data results to compare and project student performance on statewide assessments. Results will be shared in the years to come.

State Required Assessments

At NMS we use a variety of qualitative and quantitative methods (i-Ready, M-STEP, local standardized assessments) to assess the whole child. Students are assessed both formally and informally in all classes using a variety of instruments including projects, performances, and technology-based presentations. Common assessments in mathematics, language arts, science, and social studies were developed by NMS teachers and are administered to all students. The table below shows our results for the last two years for the PSAT 8 Assessment, given to every 8th-grade student in the state. It displays the scores specifically for PSAT 8 ERW (Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Score) and the PSAT Math Score, the number of students tested, the mean score for the students, and the percentages of students placed in specific state categories. NP is Not Proficient, PP is Partially Proficient, P is Proficient, and A is Advanced.
