For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2023-24. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2023-24. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Novi High School takes great pride in our tradition of academic excellence while remaining steadfast in our commitment to continuous improvement. We recognize that success is an ongoing journey, and we work diligently to address achievement gaps and ensure equitable learning opportunities for all students.

To support this mission, we have implemented an intensive Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) to identify and assist struggling learners early, providing targeted interventions and accommodations to promote their success. Our teachers employ differentiated instructional strategies to engage all students effectively, ensuring that learning experiences are tailored to meet diverse needs. Additionally, our staff participates in professional development focused on Tier 1 instructional strategies, and our instructional coach collaborates closely with educators to enhance best practices and improve student outcomes.

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Process for Student Assignments

Novi Community Schools require proof of residency within district boundaries upon registration. All 9th through 12th grade students in the Novi Community School District attend Novi High School.

School Improvement Plan

The Novi Community School District is actively engaged in the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Through MICIP, the district assesses the holistic needs of each student to develop comprehensive improvement plans and coordinate funding effectively.

This year marks the 2nd year of a five-year plan focused on enhancing student achievement. Key initiatives include:

- Reduce and Eliminate opportunity gaps to ensure strong academic performance for all students.
- Cultivate a safe and welcoming environment for all students and families.

School Description

Novi High School serves approximately 2,150 students. The student body is diverse, with about 49% identifying as Asian American, 37% as White, 8% as Black or African American, 5% as Hispanic or Latino, 1% as Multi-Ethnic, 0.4% as American Indian, and 0.2% as Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander. Our students speak 52 different home languages, and approximately 9% are English Learners.

Core Curriculum

The Novi Community School District is committed to exceeding the expectations set by the Michigan State Board of Education. To ensure a strong and consistent learning experience for all students, the district utilizes the Atlas Rubicon Curriculum Maps system. This system provides a standardized framework and easy access to both the intended curriculum and the actual curriculum used for instruction. The report contains the number and percentage of students who enrolled during the past and immediately preceding school year in one or more post-secondary courses under the post-secondary Enrollment Options Act or under section 21b of the State School Aid Act of 1979, section 388.1621b of the Michigan Compiled Laws which includes the number of courses offered, number and percent of students enrolled, number and percent of students taking a college-level equivalent credit exam for the course, and the number and percent of students whose test score level is at or above the level recommended by the testing service for college credit. The 2023-24 data is counting students one time, regardless of the number of AP courses they participated in. The total number of AP students enrolled at our school was 941. The total number of students who took one or more IB courses was 351. 988 students in total took one or more AP or IB courses.

These accomplishments are a testament to our educators' dedication, our students' perseverance, and the unwavering support of our families and community partners.
