 - Hamilton is a Michigan State School of Character
 - Been working on this for 4 years spent a year as staff learning about character education and providing students with life soft skills decided what traits were most important to teach students and picked core values started Hawk's Nest and embedded into curriculum/class expectations last year was the first year applied to be audited by character.org and go the emerging designation applied again this year (Winer, Bosio, Bovee and Recker) were thrilled this year to receive the award also receive feedback on how to be comprehensive and intentional and developing good little humans feedback on the application:
 - All staff embed character in a comprehensive way
 - Committed to character and not just academics
 - Teachers do best to meet needs of individual kids
 - Areas of growth, which staff agree with:
 - Create in our common areas like hallways and cafeteria, some visuals that show what the core values look like
 - As staff, want to move from just doing community service (doing something for someone, like fundraising) as a school to doing service learning (use what are learning in the classroom to doing something in the community that matters) – this is challenging to implement
 - Invite parents to see core values in practice in May, are going to invite students to participate in Hawk's Nest
 - One higher designation National School of Character
 - Wait until next year to consider a national designation
 - The moveable wall between the cafeteria and gym has broken and needs to be fully replaced

 the wall will remain closed for the remainder of the year for safety and functional reasons
 a purchase this large has to go to the school board and be put out for bid then items need to be ordered and installed we will have a new wall, but it won't be until sometime this summer
 - Check-in with Rob Carson, Operations Director find out if we will be one of the first schools for playground replacement and see if it impacts the Family Picnic on May 15th – think it's early enough that Family Picnic won't be impacted, but Dr. Recker will confirm
