# HALLOWEEN AT KINAWA

#### Halloween at Kinawa

Kinawa students have the option of wearing Halloween costumes to school on: Thursday, October 31, <u>If your student</u> wears a costume, they must be able to participate fully in their classes for the day, including any specials like PE, art or <u>music</u>.

Students will need to arrive at school in costumes so we can minimize the impact on instructional time. If your child forgets their costume or part of their costume, please do not bring it in and ask that it be delivered to your child. We have 750 students at Kinawa and are unable to make deliveries for forgotten costume pieces.

Please understand students <u>are not allowed to wear/bring any masks or face paint</u> while at school. Students will be asked to remove masks and wash off any face paint.

Please be reminded that **no fake (or real) weapons are allowed at school.** Students must abide by the district dress policy. Clothing must be free of inappropriate innuendo. Teachers may ask students to remove parts of costumes that become a distraction in the classroom.

Remember, Halloween dress up is optional and many 5th and 6th graders may decide not to wear costumes at school.
