- Ø Completed, signed forms are returned to the Student's teacher or either the Okemos or Haslett Public libraries for pick-up by an Okemos Masonic representative.
- Ø All students that meet the requirements and turn in a completed & signed form will be placed in a drawing for a bike and helmet. The drawing will be for one boy and one girl bike and helmet of the correct size.
