#### KINAWA COMMUNITY GARDEN INFORMATION

Come join us in the Kinawa Community Garden this year!

Several years ago, Montessori teachers and families constructed a hoop house and raised garden beds behind the tennis courts at Kinawa Middle School. A dedicated group of parent volunteers revitalized the facility in 2016 for use as a community garden for Okemos Public Schools. The Kinawa Community Garden (KCG) now has 35 community garden plots in raised beds (including 10 hoop house beds which afford year-round gardening), a well-fenced perimeter, weather-responsive irrigation, herbs, berries, perennials, a composting system, and art installations!

**Applications for 2025 are now open!** After plots are assigned to our returning members, **applications completed by 5pm on Feb 22** are selected at random. Although we usually have a waitlist at this point, we continue to accept applications; remaining plots (if any) are then assigned as first-come, first-served. Hoop house plots can be used starting early March! The application has additional information.

### REPORTING AN ABSENCE

If your child is going to be absent from school we ask that you let the school know. The easiest way to do this is to fill out this <u>Reporting an Absence form</u>. School staff check it daily and are able to update your child's attendance through it.

#### HANDICAP PARKING SPACES
