One of the most essential parts of writing is brainstorming and planning. This week, students in 6MP have been actively developing these skills in our writing lessons on historical fiction.



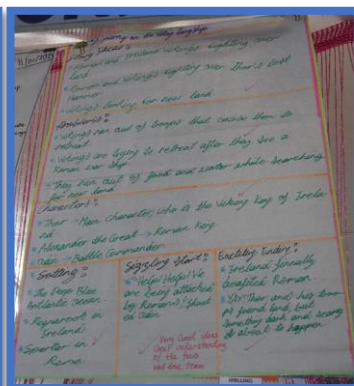
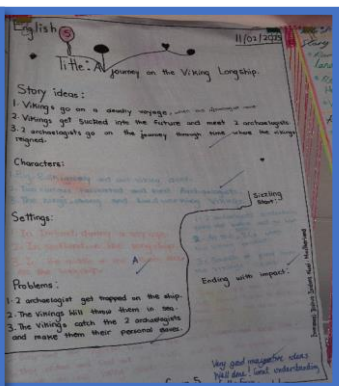
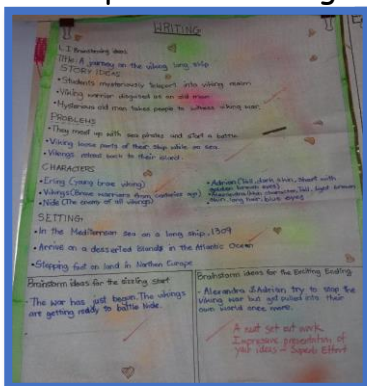
Historical fiction is a unique genre that blends factual history with imaginative storytelling. To create engaging and authentic narratives, students have been learning about key elements such as setting, character development, historical accuracy and plot structure. Through modelled writing sessions, they have learned how to brainstorm creative ideas during collaborative group activities.



During brainstorming sessions, students were encouraged to generate ideas by placing themselves in different historical periods. They explored significant events, researched cultural contexts and imagined how their characters would navigate these historical settings. This process has helped them to brainstorm creative ideas that reflects their historical understanding.

WELCOME TO THE INFORMER

Dear Parents/Guardians,

This is a reminder of the school illness guidelines.

The school has procedures in place for sending and keeping children from school when they are unwell. This is done to make sure that children are given an adequate amount of time and rest to get well before returning to school. And this also prevents the spread of illness to others.

Students with the following symptoms should remain home or may be sent home from school:

- ✚ **Fever:** Temperature of 37.7 degree Celsius or above.
- ✚ **Vomiting:** The child should be free of symptoms for 24 hours before returning to school.
- ✚ **Diarrhoea:** Two or more liquid stools in a 24-hour period. The child should be free of symptoms for 24 hours before returning to school.
- ✚ **Persistent symptoms:** Signs of illness that could disrupt the student's learning and/or pose a risk of illness to others. Examples include extreme nasal congestion, reddened eyes, sore throat, uncontrolled cough, headaches not responding to rest/medication, dizziness, lack of appetite or extreme fatigue.
- ✚ **Rash:** A contagious rash or a new, unexplained skin eruption/rash.
- ✚ **Communicable illnesses:** An illness for which you have been advised to keep your child out of school until cleared to return by your child's doctor.
- ✚ Any acute health condition in which the school staff do not feel comfortable in monitoring the student.

The Health & Wellness officer will contact you if your child becomes ill with the above symptoms while at school. If a parent/guardian cannot be reached, the emergency contact will be notified.

Please plan ahead for how your child will be cared for if they need to remain home from school or are sent home from school due to illness.

Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our school as healthy as possible this year!

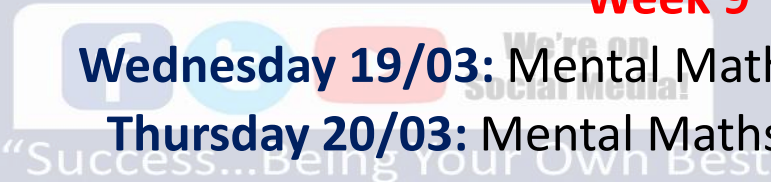

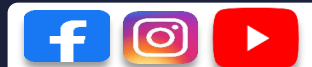
