 - BOY and MOY are used for intervention support during the school year
 - Transitioning to Amira Learning during 24/25 school year due to State provision (soft-roll out spring of 2025)
- Happy Numbers (Online) Screeners used for BOY, MOY, and EOY math benchmarks
 - Assessing: Place Value and Decimal Fractions, Multi-Digit Whole Number and Decimal Fraction Operations, Addition and Subtraction of Fractions, Multiplication and Division of Fractions and Decimal Fractions, Algebraic Expressions

 - Administers a placement assessment that places them on an individualized learning path based on strengths and weaknesses.

- Owasso's Math Proficiency Based Test (PBT) (digital) Proficiency-Based
 Assessment given to eligible 5th grade students in the spring for placement in 6th grade
 - Assessing: 6th and 7th grade math standards
- Oklahoma State Testing Program (OSTP) (online) State-required assessments: Reading (3-5), Math (3-5), Science (5)
 - Assessing: State Standards in the above-listed areas
- Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test 3rd Ed. (NNAT3) (digital 3-5, paper K-2)-Primary gifted assessment
 - o All 4th graders (5th grade 2024 only) screened in the fall
 - All 1st graders screened in the spring
- Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) (digital 3-5, paper K-2)- As needed only, second gifted assessment for students who score between 90-95% on the primary gifted assessment
