Nurse information

Students planning to participate in sports need a physical.

Physicals must be dated after April 1st

Forms should be turned in by the first day of school.

Any parent/guardian who has a religious or medical reason not to immunize their child will need to submit their objection in writing to the school nurse. This must be updated yearly. Forms are on our website under "Health Services Information"

 - The 8th grade Honors Science course





High School Credit Courses

Offered to 8th grade students

- These courses are high school level courses.
- The grades students earn in these courses go on their high school transcripts and are included in their high school GPA.
- No student is required to take a high school level course while at WWMS.
- Grade replacement policy. Students *can* retake courses at MHS to improve a grade.





New Diplomas

What do I need to know NOW?

Some students would really benefit from taking PCC and Computing Foundations for a digital age in 8th grade.

- Athletes....so you can take Weights all year.
- Band, Orchestra, Choir because these are full year electives.
- Highest Diploma Seal Will make room from more AP courses





New Diplomas

World Language Requirements -

Most basic diploma does not require a language. Colleges look for 2-3 years of a world language.

Grade Replacement Policy - If you are taking an MHS credit course at WWMS, you can take it again for a grade replacement. If you are taking classes to "open" up your high school schedule, taking the class again negates the benefit of taking it at WWMS.

BAND/ORCHESTRA/CHOIR

EXPLORING MUSIC

- Exploring Music is a 1-semester course
- Can only be taken once while at WWMS
- Students in this course receive an introduction to playing the piano, learn about music theory, music in movies, different types of music, composing and arranging
- No musical background needed to take this class, just a love of music!



7TH/8TH GRADE ART

- 7th/8th Grade Art is a 1-semester course
- Students will learn to paint, draw, work with clay, and printmaking. Students will also learn about artists and different art movements.
- There will be a focus on building individual skills and expressing creativity.






COMPUTER GRAPHICS

Offered to 6th, 7th, 8th grade students

- Computer Graphics is a 1-semester course
- Can only be taken once while at WWMS
- Students will use Photoshop and Animate to make computer-based art projects.



CERAMICS

Offered to 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students

- Ceramics is a 1-semester course.
- Can only be taken once while at WWMS .
- Students will use clay to create pots, boxes, whistles and other items. •











FACS (FAMILY AND CONSUMER SCIENCE)

Offered to 7th and 8th Grade Students

• FACS is a 1-semester course.



• Can only be taken once while at WWMS

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 Students in FACS will learn about developing their own unique personality, career planning, time management skills, nutrition and health, and how to cook certain foods.







NUTRITION & WELLNESS

Offered to 7th and 8th Grade Students

- Nutrition & Wellness is a 1-semester course.
- Can only be taken once while at WWMS



 This class introduces students to the basics of food preparation so they can become self-sufficient in accessing healthy and nutritious foods.







PE - ELECTIVE

Offered to 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students

- PE-Elective is a separate course from PE. Students who choose PE-Elective will have PE in the Fall semester and PE-Elective in the Spring semester.
- PE-Elective is a 1-semester course that builds off of the first semester of PE and includes fitness activities and faster paced games.
- Activities in this course include: Fitness Training, Fitness Testing, Strength Training, Basketball, Soccer, Floor Hockey, Ultimate Passing, Team Handball, Wiffle Ball, Ping Pong, and Flag Football.



GTT (GATEWAY TO TECHNOLOGY)

Offered to 7th and 8th Grade Students

• GTT is a 1-semester course.



- Students explore the topics of Design and Modeling, Computer Science, and Robotics.
- GTT is an introduction to engineering course. Students in GTT will learn the design process using Inventor while working to design products for real world problems.



CODING & WEB DESIGN

Offered to 6th, 7th, 8th Grade Students

- Coding & Web Design is a 1-semester course.
- Can only be taken once while at WWMS



 Topics covered include: Data and Information, Computing Devices and Systems, Programs and Algorithms, Networking and Communication, Impact and Culture, and building websites.

ENGINEERING ESSENTIALS

(MHS CREDIT)

Offered to 8th grade students

- Engineering Essentials is a 2-semester course.
- Recommended you take GTT in 7th grade (but not required).
- Engineering Essentials is a high school level course for high school credit.
- Topics include: design process, Experimental Design, and Testing, CAD and Drafting, Geographic Information System (GIS), Systems Thinking, Project Management.









SPANISH (MHS CREDIT)

- Spanish is a 2-semester, year-long course.
- ELA grades from 7th grade should be at least a B- or higher for the quarter/semester grades.
- Students will learn to read, write, speak and listen in Spanish.
- Spanish is a high school level course for high school credit. This course is the same course that is taught at MHS (Spanish I). The credits a student receives in this course will become part of the student's official high school transcript and the grades received in this course will be included in the official high school GPA.



Offered to 8th grade students

- Exploring World Languages is a 1-semester course
- Not a MHS credit course
- 8th grade students only
- This course will explore the languages taught at MHS; 9 weeks of Spanish, 4 weeks of French, 4 weeks of American Sign Language, and a cultural project.





- 1-semester course.
- Students will learn the skills and processes needed to develop computer artifacts, basic coding.
- This is a high school level course for high school credit.
- Required course for MHS diploma.



PCC (MHS CREDIT)

Offered to 8th grade students

- PCC (Preparing for College and Careers) is a 1-semester course.
- Students in PCC cover topics such as: communication, leadership, and management processes; career exploration and planning; roles and responsibilities as an individual and as family members; building employment skills and transferring academic skills to one's life work.
- PCC is a high school level course for high school credit.
- Required course for MHS diploma.



STUDY HALL

Offered to 7th, 8th grade students

- Offered for 1 or 2 semesters
- The students in Study Hall will be actively working on daily homework and check-ins with the teacher, etc.



AIDE POSITIONS

Offered to 8th grade students

- Aide Positions are 1-semester courses.
- Once schedules are final, we will look at study hall periods for students interested in serving as a guidance aide or a media center aide.
- Students will need good grades, attendance and behavior to be considered for a position as an aide.



Ranking your choices

We build the master schedules based on requests each year. Not all electives are offered each period because many teachers teach more than one course.

Because we balance class sizes, we cannot guarantee your first choice elective. By ranking electives, you help us to know what you would prefer if your first choice is not available.

Because we build the schedule each year, it is sometimes impossible to ask in the fall to switch from one class to a different one.
