Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for the Middle School at Parkside. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Middle School at Parkside has not been given one of these labels.

Our key initiatives being implemented at Middle School at Parkside to accelerate student achievement and close the persistent achievement gaps include but are not limited to PBIS rewards for attendance, achievement, and behavior; After school tutoring for four hours a week; AVID classes; Read and Math 180; Direct Instruction in Math and ELA, IXL in Math, Science, and ELA; SEL Activities in class and with Guidance Counselors.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

The Middle School at Parkside is a 6-8 program in the Jackson Public School (JPS) District. There are seven JPS elementary schools that assist in assigning pupils to the middle school program. Students are assigned to MSP based on their area of residence, or through Schools of Choice. Parents complete enrollment forms and students are placed in classrooms once this information is received. All 5th grade teachers play an integral role in assigning appropriate classes for incoming 6th graders, along with our counseling and administrative staff. The Middle School at Parkside offers student shadowing, building tours, open houses, and 6th grade orientation to aid in the transition from elementary to middle school.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The Middle School at Parkside participates in the MICIP school improvement process in an effort to monitor the implementation and effectiveness of the SIP. A team of teachers, parents and administrators meet monthly to discuss data, strengths, weaknesses and opportunities for students' academic, social and emotional growth. The main emphasis of the 3-5 year SIP continues to be improving attendance, reading growth and proficiency, parental involvement, teaching Michigan's essential content standards and implementation of the school improvement plan. A few highly effective practices used at MSP because of the SIP are multiple parent involvement activities, READ/Math 180 for non-proficient students, the implementation of the Advancement Via Individual Determination program (AVID) and advanced curriculum for gifted and talented students including high school credit/dual enrollment opportunities. The Middle School at Parkside has also entered into a partnership with the Michigan Department of Education to continuously monitor our SIP and implement a multi-tiered system of support.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

MSP offers three World Languages including German, Spanish and French. Numerous clubs such as Chess Club, Academic Games, 4-H club, Jazz Band and German Club meet after school to enhance the learning experience for interested students. Students can earn high school credit in World Languages, Algebra and Geometry. Elective offerings include AVID, World Music, Art, Design (Computers), Physical Education, diverse levels of Band, Orchestra and a variety of Special Education offerings based on students' Individualized Education Plan (IEP). For the 2023-24 school year, all students were provided a Chromebook computer to work on in person instruction as well as having access from home.

5. THE AGGREGATE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS FOR ANY LOCAL COMPETENCY TESTS OR NATIONALLY NORMED ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

All JPS students participate in the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress (M-STEP) and PSAT during the Spring in Reading, Science, Math and Social Studies. This tool helps assess student proficiency in regards to grade level state standards. Middle School at Parkside students, during the 2023-24 school year, used NWEA MAP testing to observe student progress. Below you will see our 2 most recent years of NWEA MAP data and our 2 most recent years of MSTEP/PSAT data.

6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

During fall conferences, on October 9th and 10th, 2024, we conducted parent teacher conferences in the fieldhouse so that parents/guardians could see all teachers in one area. 107 parent conferences were held with 6th grade teachers, 87 were held with 7th grade teachers, and 91 were held with 8th grade teachers. For 2025 Winter conferences, 123 parents/guardians attended conferences on January 16th, 2025 out of 763 total students enrolled.

For the Fall conferences on October 11th and 12th, 2023, we conducted parent teacher conferences in the fieldhouse so that parents could see all teachers in one area. 97 parent conferences were held with 6th grade teachers, 87 were held with 7th grade teachers, and 75 were held with 8th grade teachers for a total of 259 conferences with families. For Winter conferences, 113 parents/guardians attended conferences on January 18th, 2024 out of 768 total students enrolled.
