- **Set expectations:** Set high expectations for your child and encourage them to finish their assignments.
- **Be involved:** Participate in family engagement and volunteer opportunities. You can also get involved the parent teacher organization.
- **Support healthy habits:** Make sure your child gets enough sleep, eats a healthy diet, and exercises regularly.
- **Get to school on time:** Make sure your child gets to school every day and on time.
- **Review school materials:** Update any needed school supplies.
- **Use the school website:** The school website may have information about the school calendar, testing dates, and extracurricular activities.
- **Be authoritative:** Use an authoritative parenting style, which is firm, but fair and consistent!

GOALS FOR THE 24-25 SCHOOL YEAR

PERFORMANCE

- NWEA MAP Growth - 65% of students will meet/exceed their projected growth in reading and math from Fall to Spring
- M-STEP proficiency – increase student proficiency in math and reading by 20% per each content area-(rdg-20%/math 20%-both)- as compared to the previous year
- *PSAT –Increase the college readiness by 20% as compared to the previous year.

ATTENDANCE

- Chronic absenteeism and tardies - Decrease by 15% in comparison to the previous year's rate (both CA and Tardies)
- * Increase ADA - Goal is 95%

INTERVENTION

- Students will have an average mastery of 80% or higher of skills during scheduled intervention time.

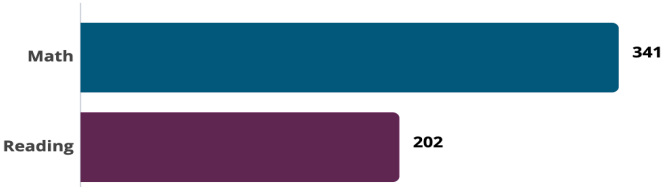

Exact Path Skills Mastery – Slight increase in mastery levels is not enough to gave skill mastery! Students need to master more skills!

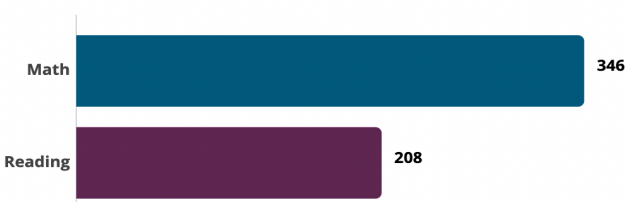
How Many Unique Skills Have Students Mastered?

How Many Unique Skills Have Students Mastered?

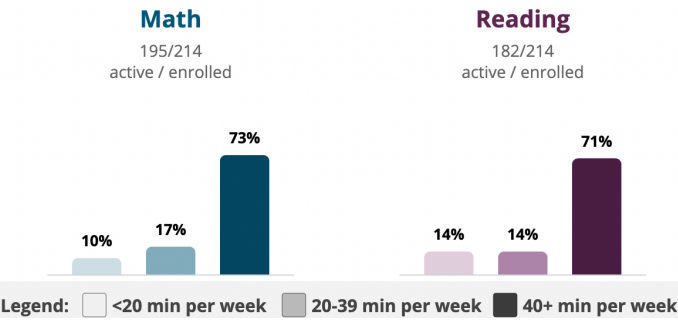
Time Period: 11/11/2024 - 11/15/2024



Exact path Results Week of 11/4 vs 11/11 –Usage needs to be above 90% for 40+ minutes of use

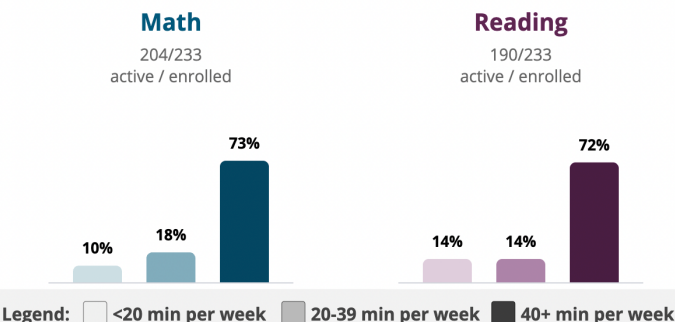
Are Students Meeting Usage Goals?

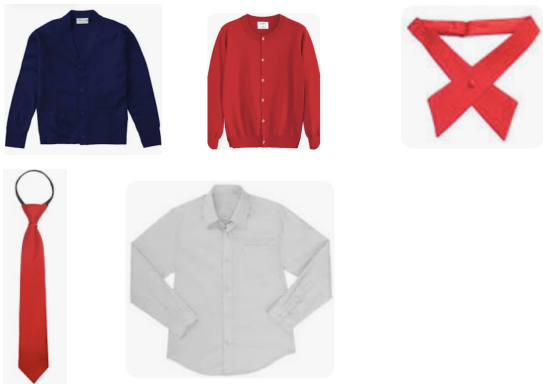
