HOW TO KEEP KIDS LEARNING DURING WINTER BREAK

The winter holiday break is a fun-filled time for you and your family to unwind and spend quality time together, but it will be over before you know it! Children's school success begins at home, and even the simplest steps can mean a big difference for your child's future. To keep your child's skills sharp and ensure a smooth transition to going back to school, Scholastic offers tips to keep kids learning:

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Parent Teacher Conference Tip

To make the most of your 2nd Quarter parent-teacher conference, prepare beforehand by reviewing your child's recent grades and assignments, discuss their school experience with them, create a list of questions for the teacher, and be ready to openly communicate about both their strengths and areas for improvement, while actively listening to the teacher's feedback; remember to focus on collaborative solutions to address any concerns that arise.

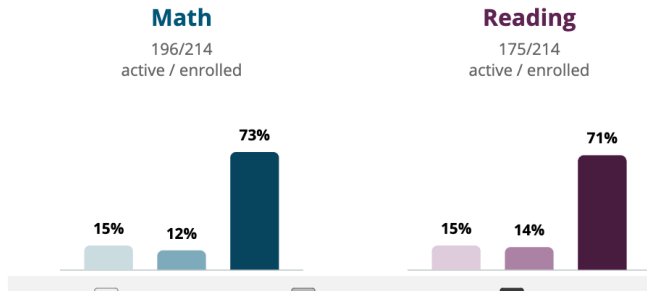
How Many Unique Skills Have Students Mastered

Time Period: 12/9/2024 - 12/13/2024

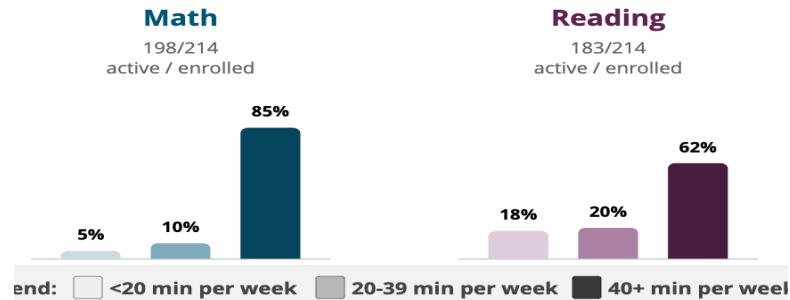


Are Students Meeting Usage Goals?
