The *Health Home Care Coordination* program assists those with multiple chronic health conditions navigate the health care system and coordinate medical and behavioral health services critical to their well-being. Care Coordinators work one-on-one with individuals to provide the supports and community resources necessary to enable members to achieve their personal goals.



Services under the agency's **OPWDD Programs** provide those with developmental disabilities the support and skills necessary to live as independently as possible. Direct Service Professionals (DSP's) work one-on-one and in groups to enable individuals to achieve their personal goals and realize their potential. EOC offers Day Habilitation, Residential Habilitation, Community Habilitation, Individual Support Services, Respite/Recreation & Non-Medicaid Coordination, and Fiscal Intermediary (FI) services to qualified individuals.

EOC's **SNUG Program** takes a collaborative approach to change the existing norm of gangrelated and non-gang related violence against its own members by partnering with residents, local businesses, and community-based organizations to develop and implement strategies that promote peace, harmony and productivity. The program employs and relies on Street Outreach Workers who live in the communities they serve, to act and



be viewed as credible messengers by those who pose the greatest risk of offense. Participants are mentored and provided with referrals to programming geared to stimulate behavioral change.



The **Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF)** program assists eligible low-income Veteran families residing in, or transitioning to, permanent housing the supportive services necessary to promote housing stability. Client-centered, goaloriented case management includes temporary financial assistance, housing counseling, employment assistance, connection to need-based entitlements, budget counseling and health/wellness treatment providers.



The **Transportation Program** provides eligible HIV+ individuals nonemergency medical transportation services so that they may achieve or maintain viral suppression. Trips to medical, mental health, legal (noncriminal), nutrition, pharmacy, dental, Department of Social Services, health education, housing, HIV support groups and substance use are covered to eliminate transportation as a barrier to continuity of care.



The agency offers several *Housing Programs* funded by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and New York State Attorney General's Office including Housing Counseling, Budget and Credit Counseling as well as Mortgage Default and Foreclosure Prevention Counseling. HUDcertified counselors are on staff to educate and guide individuals through the process.

The Suffolk County Family Court Children's Nursery

ensures a safe and secure place for children 12 months to 12 years of age to recreate while their parent(s)/guardian(s) attend Family Court in Central Islip, NY. Daily activities and healthy snacks are provided. Services are free of charge.

Way to Grow Child Care Center provides children 6 weeks to 6 years of age with a state-of-the-art space for them to learn, grow and play. Trained teachers deliver age and developmentally appropriate curricula to ensure they are prepared for kindergarten. Specialized art and music classes allow children to explore their creative side. Nutritious meals and snacks provided.

The **Community Based Initiative (CBI)** is a program geared towards increasing access to, and responsiveness of essential support services to individuals and families residing within some of Suffolk County's most vulnerable communities. EOC staff embedded in the Brentwood/Central Islip and Bellport areas, conduct outreach and facilitate referrals/linkages to eligible residents. By increasing their awareness of available programming and services, staff promote community engagement and, ultimately, self-sufficiency.



The *Family Development Program* works with eligible individuals and families on their personal goals by empowering them with the tools and resources to lessen and/or remove barriers to their achievement. Goals addressing their most critical needs (i.e. health, housing and financial well-being) are of primary focus in their journey to becoming self-reliant.



EOC offers free, confidential HIV testing services as well as individual and group prevention education under its *Targeted Prevention and Supportive Services* program. Client-centered goal planning focuses on reducing the behaviors which put them at risk of contracting and/or transmitting HIV and sexually transmitted infections (STI's) as well as those which prevent them from seeking medical treatment and care. Services include HIV Navigation Services (HNS), linkage to HIV, Hepatitis C (HCV), STI

testing/screening, PrEP/PEP, partner services and risk reduction education and appropriate ancillary services.
