- Help my parents by sharing all notices and information received by me from my school every day.






All students should be able to succeed in the 4 stages of learning

- Acquisition: The student is just acquiring the skill.
- Fluency: The student can perform the skill but it is not automatic
- **Generalization**: The student can apply a skill to different situations
- Adaptation: The student can adapt a skill to meet requirements of new tasks

(Haring et al., 1978)

Universal screeners and classroom benchmark assessments are used to identify behavioral and academic issues


The goal of MTSS is to intervene early so students can catch up to their peers

Universal Screeners - NWEA

- MAP Measure of Academic Progress
- Adaptive in nature vs. one size fits all
- Instructional Level vs. Mastery Level
- Measures what students know, regardless of their grade level.
- Measures growth over time



Overview of Standards-Based Reporting

The Syosset Central School District believes maintaining strong two-way communication with parents and guardians is essential in supporting all aspects of a child's education and growth. The report card is used to communicate student achievement, measure learning against a standard of performance, and refine our instructional practice.

The District is now using Standards-Based Report Carlet (SBRC) for grades K.S. which will provide more detailed redeaback to parent/captionates regarding free progress their child is making towards specific learning standards at each grade level. It allows parents and students to understand more clearly what is expected, and with this understanding, parents are better able to agive and support their child and to help him/her be auccessful in a rignouse scademic program. SBRC benefits students, teachers and parents/grademic by stating what is expected in the academic content
