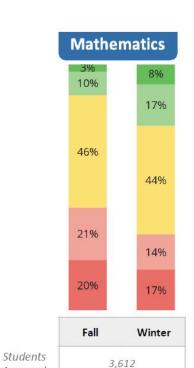

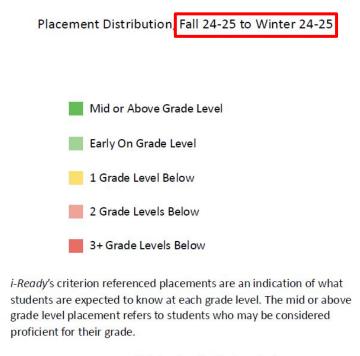

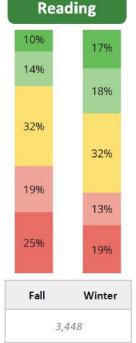


How Have Relative Placements Changed From Fall to Winter?

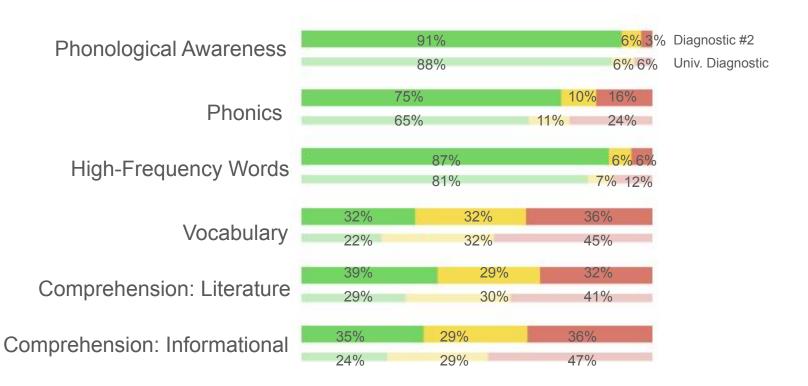

- Focus domain for ELD at each grade level (L,S,R, or W) monitored with Benchmark Express (elem) and ELPAC Interim assessments in MS

LTEL

- Adoption process for new, ELD standards - based, ELPAC-aligned ELD curriculum
- MS ELD teachers are piloting Vista's Bridges program beginning in February
- Participating in LACOE's Differentiated Assistance program to support LTELs
