At St. Louis Park Public Schools there is nothing more important than inspiring and empowering each of our students to succeed, and we center this belief when making our decisions.

Throughout my first half of the year as superintendent. I have seen the brilliance of our school community. while also observing opportunities for us to do better. I see these opportunities as a way for us to reassess our path forward.

This year, we are developing our strategic plan for 2025-30. The new plan will build off the past strategic plan work to accelerate student academic achievement. Simultaneously, we also find ourselves in a position to address budget reductions. This poses some challenges, but we will redefine what's possible with the resources available.

As a part of the budget review process, we have taken in a considerable amount of community feedback, which has led me to make some initial decisions. We are adjusting district administration, reevaluating support roles, and looking at ways to provide internal professional development opportunities for staff.
