Community Facts

The communities of Brecksville and Broadview Heights are located just fifteen minutes south of downtown Cleveland. These residential suburbs are primarily composed of families of executive, professional, business, and technical personnel. Additionally, a small portion of the eastern section of the City of North Royalton also attends the Brecksville-Broadview Heights Schools. The total school district enrollment is approximately 3,757 students.

The School District has annually earned the highest rating on the Ohio Department of Education's Local Report Card, which reports all students' scores on state assessments, as well as the rate of improvement of individual student scores.

High school students have been recognized by the National Merit Scholarship Program for the past 62 consecutive years. ACT and SAT scores are above both the state and national average. Students excel in academic and athletic competitions annually.

High School Facts

Brecksville-Broadview Heights High is a comprehensive high school with approximately 1,231 students, grades 9-12. Senior Class enrollment is 296 and the professional staff numbers 85. The school year is composed of two 90-day semesters with four 9-week grading periods. Many students participate in extracurricular and interscholastic activities. All extracurricular activities are held after school hours, and while many students volunteer, we do not have a service requirement. The math program ranges in offerings from algebra through AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics, and Calculus III. In English, social studies, and science we offer college prep, honors and Advanced Placement levels.

Advanced Placement Courses (AP)

A total of **29 Advanced Placement Courses** are offered at the high school. Students with the necessary prerequisites and staff approval may have the opportunity to take AP courses.

Graduation Requirements

A total of 21 units are required for graduation. Seniors must include 4 units English, 3 units Social Studies, 4 units Mathematics, 3 units Science, 1/2 unit Physical Education, 1/2 unit Health and 1 credit in Fine Arts. The Class of 2021 graduated with an average of approximately 26 units. There is a state waiver from physical education for participants in athletics and band.
