We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-2024 educational progress for John R. Lewis Elementary School. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) School.

John R. Lewis Elementary School's key challenges are student proficiency in ELA and Mathematics in grades 3-5. Multi-Tiered Systems of Support initiatives to accelerate student achievement include individual, small group, and whole-class instruction to meet the needs of each individual student. Best practices are utilized as well as NWEA assessments, guided reading groups, individual instruction from our Instructional Coach and paraprofessionals, and Fountas & Pinnell. Additionally, we use platforms such as iReady, Lexia, Seesaw, and Google Classroom. Students in targeted levels of achievement also participate in an extended day of learning. State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students are assigned to John R. Lewis Elementary based on their area of residence, through Schools of Choice, or through the in-district transfer process. Parents complete enrollment forms, and students are then placed in a classroom.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The School Improvement Plan is developed by the School Improvement Team through the analysis of student achievement data, attendance data, and behavioral data. This information is used to determine goals, select best-practice strategies, and monitor progress toward these goals. The plan is submitted to the Michigan Department of Education.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

John R. Lewis Elementary opened in the fall of 2021 with one class per grade K-5. It is a STEAM school with a focus on science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics.
