Dear Vikings and Families:





Family Engagement Tip for February:

Families often ask, "How can we support our kids in school?" Here are some helpful tips to support your child's learning:

- Actively communicate with your child's teacher and stay informed
- Regularly check grades and homework assignments. You can do this by accessing PowerSchool.
- Create a positive learning environment at home that allows for quiet study space, supplies, and assistance when needed.
- Encourage a love of learning. Read to or with your child and discuss what they are learning in school.
- Support learning ownership encourage your child to ask questions, engage in class, and seek help when needed.
- Attend school events. Consider volunteering and participating in things such as the PTA, School Accountability Committee, or other opportunities.
- Help your child build confidence and resilience by celebrating hard work and improvements.
- Address concerns early and look for solutions and positive ways to move forward.
- Make sure basic needs are being met, such as getting enough sleep, limiting screen time, eating healthy, and balancing responsibilities with fun or down time.

Inclement Weather Information What to Know Before the Snow

It's just a matter of time before the weather starts to turn cold and the snow starts to fly! Weather severity will determine D11's response.



What types of inclement weather decisions are there?

Depending on weather severity and how many remote learning days have been used during a school year, one of three decisions will be made:

- Full closure-all District 11 schools and offices will be closed and there is no expectation of remote working/learning.
- Two-hour delay--School will start in-person exactly two hours later than normally scheduled There will be no AM preschool, and buses will pick up exactly two hours later than normal.
 Morning Jazz Band does NOT meet on Two-hour delay days.

How are the inclement weather decisions made?

Sudden weather changes are part of what we expect in Colorado. To help us ensure the safety of our students and staff to the best of our abilities, School District 11 has appointed supervisory personnel to drive sections of the District during a predicted storm. We assign the driving sections because, as we all know, the weather in one part of our city can be completely different than in another part of the city during a storm. The supervisory personnel report on weather and road conditions, especially noting poor visibility, poor traction and other hazardous street conditions, wind chill factors, and snow accumulation. These on-the-street supervisors report their findings, and the Superintendent is briefed on the conditions. We evaluate the conditions and further driving reviews and conversations may occur.

The employee reports are used in addition to the reports from the U.S. Weather Bureau and the Colorado Springs Street Division, and in coordination with neighboring school districts. After all the data is examined, a decision is made for either a delayed start, a remote learning day, a full school closure, or school as usual. All of this usually begins the night before a storm is predicted to hit and is accomplished by 5:30 AM so you may be notified in a timely manner.

May I choose to keep my child home if the decision is made to hold in-person learning?

You as a parent/guardian make the final decision concerning the safety of your child. If you think conditions are unsafe when the District keeps schools open, you may keep your child at home. Remember to follow the proper absence reporting procedures by calling your child's school to report the absence, and your child's absence will be excused; all work may be made up without penalty.

How will inclement weather announcements be made?

The District uses the D11 Loop email, app push, and text messaging system to send announcements about inclement weather days. If you have not yet opted in to receive text messages and would like to, please visit www.d11.org/loop and follow the instructions. You may also view any of the D11 school or district websites, where an alert will automatically pop up after a decision has been made. The local TV stations (KRDO, KXRM, KOAA, and KKTV) will also report these decisions and a tweet will be shared via the District's Twitter feed, @CSSD11.

IF YOU drive a car AROUND NORTH MS

North Middle School's high percentage of commuter families means that before and after school, traffic can be a concern. We appreciate your attention to the following:

- 1. DO NOT USE or BLOCK the HANDICAP SPOTS in front of the school.
- 2. PLEASE park legally in the neighborhood. Avoid blocking driveways.
- 3. Respect the BUS ONLY LANES from the corner to the driveway on EL Paso.
- 4. Park in the lot across El Paso at Yampa or the Admin Building parking lot when our spaces out front are full.
- 5. Please **DO NOT DROP OFF** students in the **Staff Parking Lot** on the east side of the building.
- 6. Respect the traffic cones by the cafeteria personal cars are **NOT** permitted in this area.
- 7. Do not allow students to run between parked cars to cross the street. It only takes one slip for a disaster to occur. Remember that gravel and sand are just as slippery as ice!

DRESS CODE quiclelines

In general, your student's clothing should follow these guidelines:



- NO VISIBLE SHORTS, BOXERS, OR UNDERWEAR AS A RESULT OF SAGGING PANTS
- NO STRAPLESS SHIRTS OR EXCESSIVE CLEAVAGE
- ALL GRAPHICS ON CLOTHING ARE SCHOOL APPROPRIATE (AS DETERMINED BY THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION) INCLUDING NO SEXUAL INNUENDOS OR DRUG/ALCOHOL REFERENCES
- SHORTS, DRESSES, AND SKIRTS MUST APPROPRIATELY COVER THE BUTTOCKS
- NO SEE-THROUGH FABRIC
- D11 DOES NOT ALLOW BARE STOMACHS OR BACKS, PAJAMAS, SOFT-SOLE SLIPPERS, HEELIES, BANDANAS OR BANDANA ARTWORK, OR HATS/BEANIES

District II Loop

The <u>D11 Loop</u> is specifically designed to help YOU have fast and accurate information when you need it, where you need it. Our <u>North home page</u>, Instagram and Facebook stay updated with current activities. The loop allows you to manage your contact information and select your students' schools. Friends and family should register as a Community Members in order to receive our notices.

Student information is **ONLY AVAILABLE TO PRIMARY CONTACTS**.

Medications

A healthy school year for your child includes a partnership between home & school. When possible, the best approach is for parents to administer medication to their children outside of school hours. However, when your child needs medication during school, Medication forms, Asthma Health Care Plans and Allergy Health Care Plans are **REQUIRED**.

Medications (prescription AND over-the-counter) can ONLY be given at school under the following conditions:

- 1. All medications **INCLUDING OVER THE COUNTER ITEMS**, must be ordered by healthcare providers with prescriptive authority.
- 2. There must be a SEPARATE Medication Form for EACH medication.
- 3. Written permission by parent and physician must be on file at the school for all cases (that medication form again!)
- 4. All medication forms must be renewed each school year.
- 5. Medications must be in the **original**, **properly labeled container**.
- 6. All medications must be kept in the health room/office, except for students whose doctors require them to carry medications (for example: inhalers, Epi-pens, etc.) These students will need completed Care Plan paperwork on file.
- 7. Health Care Plans signed by the healthcare provider are required for Asthma/inhalers, allergies, and diabetes supplies.
- 8. If your student occasionally needs O.T.C. pain killers or allergy meds, please get the Medication form signed by the doctor and provide a small bottle of the medication to keep at the school. It is perfectly okay to have the doctor/PA/nurse to prescribe it "as needed" to cover headaches, cramps, etc.
- 9. DO NOT send cough drops, pain relievers antihistamines, etc. in with your student.

If an emergency arises and we do not have medications, we will call 911 and notify you immediately.

Attendance

If you will be picking your student up during the school day, please call the Attendance Office first thing in the morning, or at least 30 minutes prior, and we will do our best to have your child waiting and ready.

REMEMBER TO BRING YOUR PHOTO ID EACH TIME YOU PICK UP YOUR STUDENT!

Due to the volume of attendance calls we receive, we request a 24-hour window to make necessary adjustments. Please monitor PowerSchool for updates, as we are not able to return all attendance-related phone calls.

WHEN YOUR CHILD IS SICK OR ABSENT:

- Please keep sick children home. They can't learn well when they don't feel well.
- Students with fevers over 100° are not allowed to stay in school or ride the school bus
- ALL medication, including over-the-counter items such as Ibuprophin or cough drops, must have a medical form signed by a practicing physician, on file.
- Call 719-328-2435 within 48 hours to excuse students
- Absences of more than 3 days require a doctor's note in order to be excused
- Homework requests need to be made directly to the teacher via email
- Absences (such as trips) of 4 or more days require paperwork. Check with the Attendance Office. The teachers need several days' notice to create alternate assignments packets and to plan around tests and activities when you want to take work with you. Most classwork depends on in-class instruction, please do not expect to be able to use work packets to get your student completely caught up. In some classes, especially Math and World Languages, the teacher will not be able to provide advance work.
