

LINK is designed to support students with disabilities in their journey towards independence and career readiness.

LINK stands for:

Life Skills Development  
Individualized Career Planning  
Navigating Workplace Environments  
Knowledge of Resources

These components aim to provide a comprehensive framework for LINK, helping students with disabilities transition successfully into adulthood through education, skill development, and practical experience.



## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

**A student who is being referred to LINK for Full/Part Day Integrated Training:**

- Is 18 - 22 years old
- Is receiving Special Education services
- Has a current IEP with Transition Plan, Evaluation, and High School and Beyond Plan (HSBP)
- Has had the opportunity to attend four years of high school
- Has met a Graduation Pathway
- Has been recommended by the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team

## PRE-EMPLOYMENT TRANSITION SERVICES (PRE-ETS)

Pre-ETS aims to equip students who have an IEP, a 504 plan, or a documented disability with skills and knowledge for a successful transition from school to activities like employment, post-secondary education, and independent living.

Focus areas include:

- Self Advocacy
- Workplace Readiness Training
- Work-Based Learning
- Independent Living
- Post Secondary Advising

These services were developed in partnership with the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services, Division of Vocational Rehabilitation.
