# GRADUATION CREDITS

- ▶ Become familiar with the graduation requirements for your class.
- ▶ Refer to pgs. [4-7](#) of curriculum guide and mark those pages
- ▶ Know how many credits you need in each subject area in order to graduate.
- ▶ Teachers will schedule these classes first for you (core classes, Health, Careers, Financial Literacy, Spanish, lunch)
  - ▶ Spanish- must have a C in English
- ▶ Then you only need to schedule your elective classes.
  - ▶ Band is an elective

# WILL I BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PE EXEMPTION?

- ▶ If you completed two full seasons of a sport, band, or cheerleading you may be excused from taking PE classes
- ▶ Two seasons cannot be in the same year
- ▶ Two full seasons means two years of the same activity
- ▶ No partial PE exemptions will be granted
- ▶ Two seasons must be done by end of junior year
- ▶ You would need to complete ½ credit in something else for your elective requirement
- ▶ Check your transcript - is it on there? Email your counselor
- ▶ More info is on P. 27 of the curriculum guide

# ARE YOU CONSIDERING CTEC? CLASSES OF 2028-2029

- ▶ Programs are a two-year commitment and the junior class is selected from all the county high schools
- ▶ To be a good candidate you need to have your 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> courses DONE:
  - ▶ 2 English credits
  - ▶ 2 Math- including Algebra I
  - ▶ 2 Science
  - ▶ 2 Social Studies
  - ▶ 0.5 PE (2x .25)
  - ▶ 0.5 Health (9th)
  - ▶ 0.5 Careers (10th)
  - ▶ 0.5 Computers (IT)
  - ▶ \*\*\*\*\* CTEC students are exempted from meeting the Fine Art requirement

# HOW DO I KNOW WHAT MATH, SCIENCE, ENGLISH OR SOCIAL STUDIES CLASS TO TAKE?

- ▶ Current 8th grade through 11th students should have a conversation with your current subject area teacher for recommended classes and the teacher will select your level for next year.
- ▶ After next year starts in the fall, you will not be permitted to change a course level because:
  - ▶ You did not complete summer work
  - ▶ You lost your nerve
- ▶ Starting in the fall, all level changes with courses will be teacher initiated! You cannot shop for classes!

# WHAT IF I DO NOT AGREE WITH A TEACHER RECOMMENDATION?

- ▶ The recommendation is based on your current grade, work ethic and predicted success in the next course
- ▶ Have a conversation with your present teacher
- ▶ If you and your parent/guardian feel the teacher recommendation is not the right one, you and your parent/ guardian can contact your school counselor

**Helpful Tips:**

- If you took MS IT in 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade you do not need to take another IT course unless you want to. (Class of 27 is the last class to possibly have earned this at the MS)
- If you want band, please schedule that for a full year (Course number 1210)
- By the end of sophomore year, students need to have completed an IT course (.5 credits), Health (.5 credits), 2 PE classes (.25 Credits each), and Careers (.5 credits)
- Please note this form is only to help students select courses, it does not indicate the exact order in which they will appear on a student's schedule.

**Schedule Change Policy:** Schedule changes will only be permitted for those students who do not meet a prerequisite for a scheduled class, for those students who attend summer school or for changes deemed necessary by the counselors and/or administration due to academic misplacement. No schedule changes after the schedule change period ends, will be made unless initiated by a teacher and approved by the principal.
