Our program has multiple events throughout the year. A yearly schedule of events can be found on our website and will be sent home with your child. Morning drop-off begins at 7:30 a.m. and classes start at 8:00 a.m. Students need to be in classrooms by 8:00 and are late after 8:00 a.m. If they are late a parent must walk them to the office to sign-in that their child is tardy. Dismissal begins at 2:30 p.m. for grades PK-4 and 2:35 p.m. for grades 5-8. We use a staggered dismissal system to help with traffic congestion. Parents must specify a regular afternoon transportation method. You can choose to designate your child as a car rider or bus rider. Any changes to the method you select must be communicated to your child's teacher in writing.

If students are eating breakfast they need to be in the building by 8:00 a.m. at which time they will report to the lunchroom. Breakfast and lunch are free for all students in our program. You may also send lunch if you choose to do so.

Fast food of any kind is not allowed in the lunchroom unless approved by the building administration.

Please remember to always send money in sealed envelopes w/name and the purpose of the money clearly noted. (Example: Tommy Smith, t-shirt money)

Dublin City Schools operates on nine-week grading periods. Parents of students in grades K-12 can access grades online in real-time through the Parent Portal of our Infinite Campus Platform. You can request a login through our Central Registration Department or by contacting your child's teacher and/or administrator.

Put your child's name on all supplies, coats, etc. with a permanent marker.

Medicine cannot be administered at school without a signed release from the doctor. Students may not have medicine in their possession at school. All medicine is to be kept and secured in the nurses' clinic.

Our policy is not to dismiss children through the office after 2:15 p.m. The outside doors are locked at all times. All visitors must sign-in with our front desk and wear a visitor's badge.

### THE IGA'S DRESS CODE

The use of a dress code provides a common element upon which the culture of a school is built. At IGA, we want our students to be known by the content of their character and their abilities, rather than by fashion. Students at IGA will adhere to the following:

### Tops:

Shirts can be any solid color, polo-style or button down oxford, or t-shirts, short or long sleeves with images, emblems, or artwork no larger than 3 inches. Any symbol larger than three inches is too big. Any shirt with a Dublin City Schools / IGA logo, insignias, DCS sports team, or club can be worn any time. No tank tops, lace, sheer, or see-thru, or crop tops that show a student's mid-section/stomach will be allowed. The tucking in of shirts by boys is highly encouraged. If shirts are excessive in size or length, students may be asked to tuck them in.

### **Bottoms:**

Must be solid khaki, black, blue or grey uniform or denim-style pants, skirts, skorts, capri pants, or jumpers. Cargo pants are allowed, but they must be the same as the colors above. Form fitting yoga pants, sweatpants, or joggers are not allowed. Pants, shorts, jeans must NOT be torn, ripped, cut or frayed or have holes of any kind. Leggings CANNOT be worn as "stand alone" attire. They can be worn under skirts/shorts and must be a solid color. Skirts/shorts must be no shorter than the fingertips when arms are extended and/or two inches above the knee. NO SAGGING OF BOTTOMS ALLOWED!!!

### **Shoes:**

Shoes may be any color. Students must wear safe and appropriate shoes at all times. All shoes must have an enclosed toe. Students cannot wear slides, Crocs, shower shoes, flip flops, cleats, heels, or spiked high heels to school.

### **Outerwear:**

Students will be allowed to wear sweatshirts or jackets with hoods attached while on campus. However, hoods cannot be worn on or over the head while on campus. Sweater vests and cardigan sweaters may be worn over the standard uniform shirt and may be of any solid color. Solid color turtlenecks can be worn. No restrictions on jacket colors, but outerwear cannot bear inappropriate messages or images.

### **Belts/Accessories:**

Belts must be leather or cloth and worn in the belt loops. Buckles must be plain and not oversized, ornate, or offensive in design or message. Accessories (earrings, bracelets, rings, etc.) cannot be oversized or in excessive amounts. No jewelry is allowed that will distract in noise or in appearance in the school or classroom.

### **Headgear:**

Absolutely no hats, hoods, baseball caps, bandanas, or sunglasses may be worn on campus unless the administration authorizes it for a special occasion.

### Team Attire:

Dublin City Schools team attire may be allowed on specified days and at the approval of the building principal.

The administration shall have the authority to make a case by case determination for the appropriateness of student dress which is not covered in this policy. The principal also has discretion for determining any action for a student's attire, body piercing, or tattoos that are deemed offensive, gang related or distracting. Violation of the IGA's Dress Code Policy is covered in the Student Code of Conduct.

### IGA DRESS CODE EXAMPLES

The dress code will be enforced **DAILY** at the Irish Gifted Academy. Please assist us by ensuring that your child is dressed following the school-wide dress code. When we have to call parents for repeated violations, this not only interferes with your child's instructional time, but it also impacts his/her participation in upcoming school-wide events.

**SOLID COLOR** polos/polo style dresses may be worn.



Traditional, basic denim jeans and basic uniform bottoms may be worn any day.
Acceptable colors include: KHAKI, BROWN, NAVY BLUE, BLACK OR GRAY.



Any shirt with a
Dublin City Schools /
IGA logo, insignias,
DCS sports team, or
club can be worn any
time.



Although this is a solid color polo, the insignia is larger than 3 inches.



Jeans may not have any predesigned rips, tears, holes or frays as to expose skin.
Jogger sweatpants are NOT acceptable.



Crocs, bubble shoes, slides, etc. may NOT be worn unless it is a specified "Dress Down Day."


**Step 2:** Click on the Families Heading > Infinite Campus Parent Portal.

<u>Step 4:</u> Find your individual username & password by navigating to the on-screen announcement & clicking HERE.





We believe that a safe, secure, flexible and loving environment promotes positive learning communities for academic achievement, personal growth, and emotional well-being.



Our highly-trained safety and security staff monitor, protect and respond 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Our paramount duty is to create a safe learning environment where each student can learn, discover and thrive.

Safety and security staff support and assist in the training of all district staff to be prepared to respond to natural- or human-caused emergencies. We work with communications and school staff to inform families about emergencies as soon as we can with as much information as possible.

We are committed to creating a safe environment in every school, every day. We put a high priority on building relationships with students. And, our safety and security officers proactively work to support our district's promise of supporting the needs of the whole child.

### **COMMUNICATION DURING AN INCIDENT**

In the event of a snowstorm, hurricane, threat to campus or other emergency event, Dublin City Schools will implement safety procedures and may change school start or dismissal times for student safety. Here are the ways we communicate emergency information:

- Automated messages through ParentSquare. Please provide your school with current telephone numbers to reach you and other emergency contacts.
- · Announcements on district and school websites.
- Announcements on social media. Please follow us on Facebook. Twitter and Instagram.
- · Announcements on TV and radio.

Student safety is our number one priority. Our schools have safety plans in place to handle natural disasters, security issues, and other emergency situations, in coordination with local law enforcement and first responders. Help us keep your child safe by following these emergency DOs and DON'Ts.

# Bookmark our Website: We will post the latest available information at dcsirish.com. Check back frequently for updates and instructions on when and where you can pick up your child if parent pick-up is necessary.



Get Connected: Make sure we have your current phone number and email address on file so we can reach you quickly with an automated text, or email about an emergency situation. When you move, change jobs, or get a new number, please update your contact information with your child's front office.



# Have Identification Ready: Always bring a photo ID when picking up your child. This supports school staff with verifying identities quickly and maintaining the safety of all students.



Plan Ahead: Discuss reunification plans with your child ahead of time so they understand the process and won't be alarmed. Let them know to follow their teacher's instructions and not try to leave the school on their own.

### **DON'T**



### Call Your Child's School:

Resources are stretched thin during emergencies. Incoming calls take away from our ability to get updates to you through our website, mass notification system, and social media platforms.



Rush to the School: Coming to school may put you or your child at great risk. Additional people on the scene distract first responders from their primary job – keeping our students and staff safe. Instead, check our website, social media channels or your phone for information and instructions.



Share Unverified
Information: Avoid
spreading unverified
information through social
media or other means. This
can lead to confusion and
hinder the efforts of
emergency responders and
the district.



### Attempt to Circumvent Security Procedures:

Even if the process seems slow, do not attempt to pick up your child from unauthorized locations or before you've been notified.

This will ensure everyone's safety.
