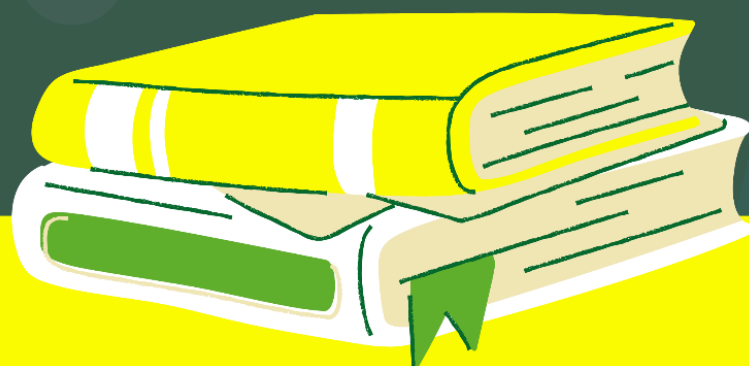

A FEW HILLCREST ELEMENTARY SCHOOL SPECIFICS

ARRIVAL & START TIME:

School begins promptly at 8:00 AM each day, with homeroom activities starting at 8:00 AM followed by academic classes. Students who are car riders and walkers should enter the building from the rear under the ramp beginning at 7:30 AM. All cars should be in the inside lane (closest to the building) as they drop off their student(s). Only bus riders will be allowed to enter the front entrance of the school between 7:30 - 8:00 AM. Upon arrival, students will receive breakfast and report to their classroom. Students planning to eat breakfast should arrive by 7:45 AM.

TARDINESS:

Students are expected to arrive at school on time. **Students who arrive after 8:00 AM will need to enter the building from the front entrance of the school and will be marked tardy.** We encourage you to have your child here no later than 7:45 AM. Five tardies and/or early dismissals are considered as one (1) unexcused absence.

DISMISSAL:

Students will be dismissed at 3:00 PM each day unless they are deemed as partial days, which will be communicated prior to the days. Once dismissed, students should leave the school campus immediately unless he or she is detained by a teacher or the principal. **Parents must pick up their children on time!** Car riders will use both lanes to drive up to the ramp and pick up students. Staff members will load students and direct cars when they can pull off and merge back into one lane. You may only make right turns. Please pay attention to the staff member who is directing traffic. This ensures the safety of our students as well as other stakeholders.

EARLY DISMISSAL:

Parents must sign the student out in the office for the student to leave early, and the student must check in with the office if he/she returns during the school day. For security reasons, anyone checking out a student **will be required** to show a picture I.D. (i.e. Driver's License) **prior** to having a child released to exit the building with him/her; in addition, the parent or guardian checking out the student will also have to sign out students through the school's secure student information system (Infinite Campus). The teachers are **not permitted** to release students from the classroom. Your understanding and cooperation are greatly appreciated as this is a safeguard for all our children. Early checkout should be reserved for special circumstances and not used as a student's regular method of dismissal.

NO EARLY DISMISSALS WILL BE ALLOWED AFTER 2:30 PM

ANY CHILD NOT GOING HOME HIS/HER USUAL WAY, MUST BRING WRITTEN INSTRUCTIONS FROM THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN (with a working phone number, dated, and signed to the school). ABSOLUTELY NO CHANGES IN TRANSPORTATION WILL BE MADE OVER THE TELEPHONE OR AFTER 12:00 PM. Again, your understanding and cooperation is appreciated as this is a safeguard for all our children.

ELEMENTARY DRESS CODE

(KINDERGARTEN - 4TH GRADE)

Want to dress cool for school and still follow the rules? Here's how!

Tops

- Solid Color "Polo-style" or button down oxford long or short sleeve shirt
 - Any solid color shirt
- Can be short or long-sleeved
- Emblems can be no larger than an "inch"
 - Any symbol bigger than a "quarter" is too big!
- Any shirt with the schools' logos, insignias, sports team, or club can be worn any time and all other Dublin City School spirit shirts can be worn on Fridays.
 - Absolutely NO
 - Sheer
 - Lace
 - See-thru

Shoes

- Shoes may be any color.
- All shoes must have an enclosed toe and strap on the back.
- Absolutely NO
 - Sandals
 - Flip-flops/slides
 - Cleats
 - Heelies
 - Spiked heels
 - Crocs

Outerwear/Accessories

- Students can wear sweatshirts or jackets with hoods.
 - Hoods CANNOT be worn inside of school.
- Solid Color sweaters, sweatshirts and cardigan may be worn.
 - These must be over a uniform shirt.
 - Solid color turtlenecks can be worn.
- No restrictions on jacket colors
- No inappropriate slogans or inappropriate messages
- No trench coats or dusters
- Belts must be leather or cloth
 - no oversized or ornate accessories of any kind

Bottoms

- Uniform-Style
 - Colors are khaki, brown, black, navy blue or grey.
 - Cargos are allowed but they must be the same as the colors above.
- Joggers
 - Joggers ARE allowed but MUST be the uniform-style pant and can't be sweat pant type material
 - NO SAGGING!
- Jeans
 - Must not have any rips, holes, tears, or frays.
 - NO SAGGING!
- Leggings
 - Leggings can NOT be worn as "stand alone" attire. They can be worn under skirts/shorts and must be a solid color.
- Skirts
 - Must be no shorter than fingertips when arms are extended.

For the 2025-2026 school year, absolutely NO CROCS will be allowed at school.

Absolutely NO

- Hats
- Hoods
- Caps
- Bandanas
- Sunglasses

The principal shall have the authority to make case by case determinations for the appropriateness of dress which is not covered in this policy.



DRESS CODE EXAMPLES

The dress code will be enforced **DAILY** at Hillcrest Elementary School. Please assist us by ensuring that your child is dressed following the school-wide dress code. When we have to call parents for repeated violations, this not only interferes with your child's instructional time, but it also impacts his/her participation in upcoming school-wide events.

YES



Traditional, basic denim jeans (blue or black) may be worn any day. Notice that these jeans do **NOT** have any rips, tears, holes, or frays.



SOLID COLOR polo style dresses (**ONLY**) or basic **UNIFORM** jumpers may be worn by girls.



Basic uniform bottoms may be worn.
Acceptable colors include:
KHAKI, BROWN, NAVY BLUE, BLACK, or GRAY

*These are the **ONLY** color bottoms that are permitted, unless it is a "dress down" day, which will be communicated in advance.

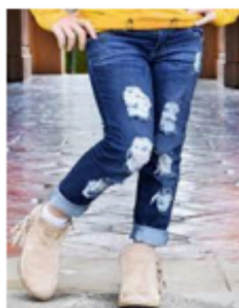
NO



Crocs, bubble shoes, slides, etc. may **NOT** be worn this year, unless it is a specified "Dress Down" day. Dress down days will always be communicated in advance.



While this is a polo style dress, it is **NOT** in dress code because it is not a **solid** color.



Jeans may not have any pre-designed rips, tears, holes, or frays as to expose skin, or any beyond basic wear & tear.

Such jeans will only be permitted on "Dress Down" days, which will be communicated in advance.

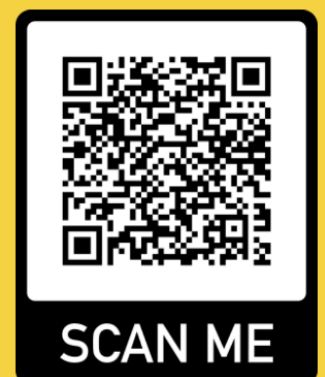

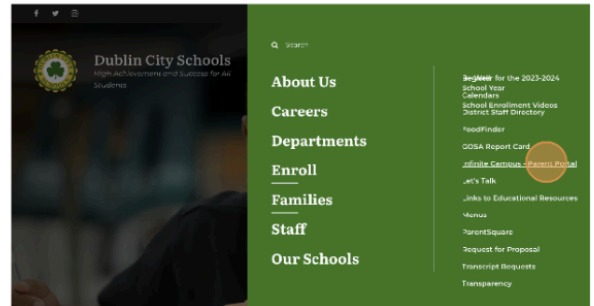

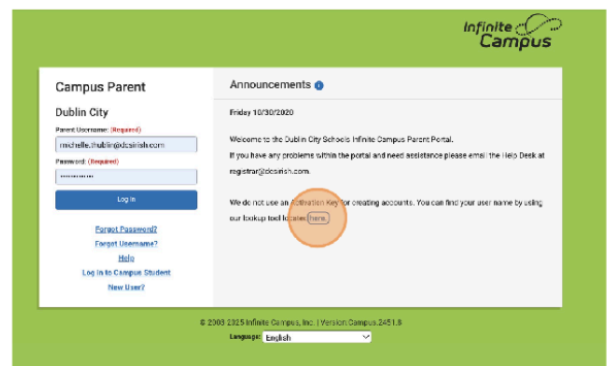
Step 2: Click on the Families Heading > Infinite Campus Parent Portal.











We believe that a safe, secure, flexible and loving environment promotes positive learning communities for academic achievement, personal growth, and emotional well-being.



Our highly-trained safety and security staff monitor, protect and respond 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Our paramount duty is to create a safe learning environment where each student can learn, discover and thrive.

Safety and security staff support and assist in the training of all district staff to be prepared to respond to natural- or human-caused emergencies. We work with communications and school staff to inform families about emergencies as soon as we can with as much information as possible.

We are committed to creating a safe environment in every school, every day. We put a high priority on building relationships with students. And, our safety and security officers proactively work to support our district's promise of supporting the needs of the whole child.

COMMUNICATION DURING AN INCIDENT

In the event of a snowstorm, hurricane, threat to campus or other emergency event, Dublin City Schools will implement safety procedures and may change school start or dismissal times for student safety.

Here are the ways we communicate emergency information:

- Automated messages through ParentSquare. Please provide your school with current telephone numbers to reach you and other emergency contacts.
- Announcements on district and school websites.
- Announcements on social media. Please follow us on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram.
- Announcements on TV and radio.

Student safety is our number one priority. Our schools have safety plans in place to handle natural disasters, security issues, and other emergency situations, in coordination with local law enforcement and first responders. Help us keep your child safe by following these emergency DOs and DON'Ts.

DO: PREPARE IN ADVANCE



Bookmark our Website: We will post the latest available information at dcsirish.com. Check back frequently for updates and instructions on when and where you can pick up your child if parent pick-up is necessary.



Get Connected: Make sure we have your current phone number and email address on file so we can reach you quickly with an automated text, or email about an emergency situation. When you move, change jobs, or get a new number, please update your contact information with your child's front office.



Have Identification Ready: Always bring a photo ID when picking up your child. This supports school staff with verifying identities quickly and maintaining the safety of all students.



Plan Ahead: Discuss reunification plans with your child ahead of time so they understand the process and won't be alarmed. Let them know to follow their teacher's instructions and not try to leave the school on their own.

DON'T



Call Your Child's School: Resources are stretched thin during emergencies. Incoming calls take away from our ability to get updates to you through our website, mass notification system, and social media platforms.



Rush to the School: Coming to school may put you or your child at great risk. Additional people on the scene distract first responders from their primary job – keeping our students and staff safe. Instead, check our website, social media channels or your phone for information and instructions.



Share Unverified Information: Avoid spreading unverified information through social media or other means. This can lead to confusion and hinder the efforts of emergency responders and the district.



Attempt to Circumvent Security Procedures: Even if the process seems slow, do not attempt to pick up your child from unauthorized locations or before you've been notified. This will ensure everyone's safety.
