After graduating from Harvard, Joe joined The Dallas Morning News, where he was part of a team of reporters who received a Pulitzer Prize for international reporting for their stories on violence against women around the world.

Joe became the China correspondent for The Wall Street Journal in 1994 and joined The New York Times in 1998. In 2006, Joe won his second Pulitzer Prize for international reporting for his coverage of the rule of law in China. As his tenure with The New York Times went on, Joe rose to lead their international desk and was named the newspaper's Managing Editor in 2016.

Since 2022, Joe has served as the Executive Editor of The New York Times, where he oversees all aspects of the newspaper's global newsroom and news report.
