

## **CONSTRUCTION (ALMOST) COMPLETE!**

These early years have been full of big milestones. Without a doubt, finishing the construction of our 40,000 sq. ft. facility will be among them. Our Phase 1 space earned three architecture awards and visible delight when visitors first entered our space. Soon we'll have new dedicated spaces to further build our offering and community.







- A dedicated Communications Technology Lab with an attached editing suite and iMacs to support higher end creative work will be a welcome home to the remarkable work already happening in that department.
- A Prototyping Makerspace will support more of the hands-on learning and creating that we're keen to help grow here.
- Our Student Services hub will support our growing student body, differentiated learning, and postsecondary planning.
- MacLachlan Hall will be our new assembly space, available for large gatherings as well as more room for our physical education offerings.
- A dedicated music room, multimedia studio, second science lab, and multiple new classrooms and breakout spaces will also be exciting to enjoy in the coming weeks.

## KCS By Design (KBD) - Student Leadership in Media Literacy

A student in our Civic Engagement KBD Committee is in his third year raising awareness of politics, civic issues, and the importance of critical thinking when consuming news. Last spring, he brought to our attention an impressive resource to help: a global news aggregator and Ontario start-up called <u>Ground News</u>. It not only gathers news articles from around the world (60,000 a day from 50,000 sources), it also takes compelling steps to help us all read with the care and critical thinking that's needed.

Earlier this school year, the student delivered presentations to our KCS Teacher Librarian, other faculty, and me. Thanks to his leadership, KCS has a new school-wide subscription and reading the news now includes a visible measure of each sources' record on accuracy and bias. It also includes information on the ownership structure of each news source. All articles come with easy links to the same story from different sources, making it seamless to learn about news from multiple sources and perspectives. Finally, because difference-making requires much more than just buying a solution, this student leader will lead the effort to promote this new resource and help teachers who wish to introduce it to their students.

Active citizenship has long been a core value of KCS. Developments in the world make this more important than ever. Students care about the world and want to help make it better. Inviting students to lead in ways that matter to them is an inspiring way to do so.



# KCS Path Program - Now Including Mentorship from our Grade 12 Students

The Advisor Program in Grade 12 includes our most senior students exercising leadership of all kinds, sometimes stepping in where needed and many other times initiating something brand new for our community. A drive to gather gently used formal dresses to help the charity <a href="Prom Glitz">Prom Glitz</a> was the most recent and hugely successful example.



Starting this Semester, our Grade 12 students will also offer Path mentorship to our Grade 9 students. Most students joining in Grade 9 aren't used to the challenge posed by Path; all will benefit from the earned experience of our Grade 12 students.

We look forward to their help as Grade 9 students wrap up their first year initiatives, learning about their topics from the lenses of academics, arts, athletics, citizenship, and off site learning.
