

# Youth at the Booth Poll Working

## May 6th Primary Election

**Learn more about democracy and make \$150 in one day!**

### Requirements

**You must be:**

- 17 years or older and in good academic standing (passing your classes)
- a U.S. citizen
- a resident of Franklin County
- able to attend a poll worker training in the WKHS Library on Monday, March 17th from 6:00 - 8:00 pm
- able to provide your own transportation to your assigned polling station (could be in Worthington, but could be somewhere else in Franklin County), and plan to work for the entire election day, from 5:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m.

### Application and Training Process:

- **If you are a new Youth at the Booth Worker:** Scan this QR code and apply to be a Youth at the Booth (not a regular Poll Worker). Submit your application by Monday, March 10th. Use a PERSONAL email address, NOT your school email address.



- **If you are a returning Youth at the Booth Worker:** scan the QR code, log in using your previous information, click on “My Availability” and mark yourself as “Available” for the May 6th election.
- **If you are 18 years old, register to vote online** by April 7th. To complete your Voter Registration online, you must have the last four digits of your Social Security number AND your Ohio Driver’s License/Permit or State ID number. If you think you are already registered, you can also check your status at the [Franklin County Board of Elections](#). Select “View my Voter Registration” to verify your registration. If you are not 18 years of age by election day, you cannot yet register to vote - but soon!.
- **Attend the mandatory poll worker training on Monday, March 17th, from 6:00-8:30 in the WKHS Library.** If you would like to be a poll worker but cannot attend this training, please let Mrs. Glaros know ASAP. There will be trainings at other high schools, but you must contact her EARLY to find out about them. Please plan ahead and arrive ON TIME for the training – if you are more than 5 minutes late, you might be ineligible to participate.
- **Exercise your right to vote!** If you will be 18 years old, you can vote in the election. Request an absentee ballot from the Franklin County Board of Elections Office so that you can vote by mail and do not have to go to your own polling location the day of the election. - **Work at your assigned polling location on May 6th.** Plan to arrive by 5:30 a.m. and work until 8:30 p.m. (with about an hour lunch break). Plan to wear the shirt you receive at the training and be helpful to all voters.
