

The \$5.5 million dollar project is a joint venture utilizing both public and private funds. The project would involve building a 5,000-square-foot orchestra room addition; renovating both the band and choir rooms; and providing an updated state-of-the-art auditorium with acoustic, lighting, and seating improvements at Hudson High School.

Naming rights are still available for donations and pledges in excess of \$250,000. First Grade Class Donates to Humane Society


First grade students in Mrs. Kelly Grannis' classroom learned a little about economics and philanthropy at the same time.
