Helping Your Child With Comprehension

Understanding what we read or what is read to us is the ultimate goal of reading. Here are some questions and/or things to think about and discuss **after** reading with your child:


- Retelling the story with beginning, middle, and end.
- Setting: Where did the story happen?
- Main Idea: What was this story mostly about? (Who did what where?)
- Characters: Who was in the story? What did we learn about (character name)?
- Making Connections: Did this story remind us of an experience in our life? Another book we have read? A movie we have seen? Something we already learned about?

How to Help Your Child Think About Reading

The purpose of reading is to gain meaning. **Predicting** is a strategy in which the reader thinks about what is going to read based on clues from the text. Predicting keeps the reader's mind actively engaged in reading as he/she is trying to figure out what will happen next. Here are some questions to ask your child to reinforce the skill of **predicting**:

- Look at the title and the picture on the cover. What do you think this book will be about?
- During reading: "What do you think is going to happen next in the story?" Also ask, "What causes you to think that?"
- What do you think will happen next?
- How do you think (the character) will solve the problem?
- How do you think the story will end?


Favorite February Picture Books

Help Your Child Become a Fluent Reader

Fluency refers to the way reading sounds. Fluent readers pay attention to punctuation. They read in smooth phrases at an appropriate pace using necessary expression. This month we will focus on **rate**.

- Encourage your child to reread books. Expression and rate should improve with each consecutive reading.
- It's important to read frequently. The more a student reads, the more progress will be made in all areas of
- reading.
- Read aloud to your child. It is important that your child hear fluent reading to know what his reading is supposed to sound like.


