### Treasurer's Report – Lisa Earles

Occasionally, you will see a not budgeted or unexpected line-item on the statements - examples from this set of statements include a non-income pass thru from letting the mime/improv group use the CPI Venmo for payments that go straight to them, taking out cash for Toys for Tigers (and getting some of it back), paying for some warm clothing with the Feed the Pod Fund, and purchasing the required binders for students who weren't able to buy one. In January, business sponsorships came in, and we received more matching funds from the fall fundraiser that hit late. This is also when the CPI was reimbursed by the school for the remaining Toys for Tigers funding.

## Guest Speakers – Joe Rich, IH Counselor

# For 8<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> graders:

- Counselors from 9<sup>th</sup> grade came down to speak to 8<sup>th</sup> graders about classes for 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Students picked electives
- Counselors are coming back to IH to go over their plan
- Course Planner has 9-12<sup>th</sup> grade classes
  - o Students put in classes/electives needed for 9<sup>th</sup> grade.
  - o Students are welcome to put in classes for 10-12<sup>th</sup> grade classes as well.
  - o If students change classes, it will automatically update on the Course Planner.
- 2 types of Biology in 9<sup>th</sup> grade now: Regular biology and Advanced Biology
  - Kids taking Advanced Biology in 9<sup>th</sup> grade will get college credit (4 DMACC credit). Whatever grade you get in it will go to your DMACC transcripts.
  - o After the first semester in 9<sup>th</sup> grade you can drop down to regular bio if student wants.
- **PE Waiver for High School** Available if you are taking full academic schedule or if you play a sports.

# For 7<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> graders:

- o Students will get an opportunity to take advanced classes.
  - o If you take advanced Science in 8<sup>th</sup> grade, you will take Biology in 9<sup>th</sup> grade. You will get high school credit and will impact your GPA.
- o Aside from the core classes, wheel classes, and PE, they have opportunity for elective courses.
- o If any changes are needed, email Mr. Rich.
- o In 8<sup>th</sup> grade music is no longer a required class.
- o 8<sup>th</sup> grade Art Class meets 2<sup>nd</sup> semester in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. An every other day class.
- o Spanish 1 is an elective. It meets every day. Gets High school credit and will impact your high school GPA.
  - o No world language is required to graduate from Valley.
  - o Most colleges require World Language.
  - o If you took 4 years of language in High School you don't need to take language at University of Iowa.

- o You may also need to take a placement test.
- o In 9<sup>th</sup> grade you can take Spanish, French, and German.

7<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> grade – Not a lot of exceptions for PE Waiver.

### Principal/Assistant Principal Update - Dr. Shane Christensen & Mr. Zac Sinram

- Sweetheart Dance Good turnout. First time ever having dance and conferences at the same time. If we can keep After the Bell bussing available, may get more students to participate. 3 organizations benefiting from it: Support LA Fires, Friends of YJI, and RISE scholarship fund. Only virtual conferences on the night of the Dance.
- School Improvement Goals Update First goal around attendance we are at 90% attendance, above our goal.

Behavior goal – 98% of students have not come to office more than twice. Academic – 95% of students have either As, Bs, and Cs. Spring School is available for students who have failed any subjects. Possibility of summer school for any students who fail spring classes.

Caring Adult Survey – Students take a survey to make sure that all students have at least one adult in the building they feel like they can connect with and talk to.

**Mr. Sinram** is taking a new role as Athletic Director at Valley. 8<sup>th</sup> graders will work with Mr. Sinram in his new role.
